



POSSIBLE DEEP-SEA PORT OFF PATUAHKHALI Hasina invites Dubai firm for feasibility study

Also for marine driveway, special economic zone in Ctg

UNB, Abu Dhabi

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday invited the Dubai Port World Authority (DP World) to conduct a feasibility study on constructing a deep-sea port at Pairs in Patuakhali.

During a meeting with Sultan Ahmed bin Sulayem, chairman of the DP World, Hasina also requested him to carry out a feasibility study on construction of a marine driveway

and a special economic zone in Chittagong. Foreign Secretary M Shahidul Haque briefed reporters after the meeting at the PM's hotel suite in Abu Dhabi.

Shahidul said the prime minister and the DP World chairman gave special emphasis on construction of a deep-sea port at Pairs, naval base and big power plant.

They also had a discussion on construction of a 150km marine drive from Mirsarai to

MEDICAL, DENTAL COLLEGES Admission test results published

Admission test results of medical and dental colleges in the country were published yesterday with a pass rate of 34 percent.

Out of 66,987 examinees, 22,759 passed the written tests held for a total of 10,299 seats available in 29 government and 56 private medical colleges, and nine government and 23 private dental institutions, said Zahid Maleque, state minister for health and family welfare ministry, at a press briefing at the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

Drive against unfit autos starts Nov 10 Unlicenced drivers also target

The government will clamp down on unfit vehicles and drivers, who do not have licence or have fake licence, from November 10 to reduce road accidents in the country.

Mobile courts assisted by officials of Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) and district administrations will launch the drives in every district. Vehicles without fitness certificates will be seized and fined while unregistered drivers will be imprisoned or fined or will face both the punishments.

The decision was taken at a meeting with Road Transport and Bridge Minister Obaidul Quader in the chair at BRTA office in the capital yesterday, a week into the country's one of the deadliest road crashes that killed at least 36 people in Natore.

According to BRTA officials, the number of unfit vehicles is some three lakh while the estimated number of unregistered and fake drivers is four lakh.

Unfit vehicles and unskilled drivers are among the major reasons behind frequent road accidents, said the officials.

A five-member body on Wednesday revealed that the two buses, one belonging to Keya Paribahan, which collided


