



Life along the barbed wires

The vibrant and festive BotTala Rongomela 2014, being held at the National Theatre Hall of the Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy, saw audience turn up in very encouraging numbers on the second day (October 25), as Aranyak staged their new play "Bhongobongo", following a puppet show at the hall premises by Puppetiana. Written by Mamunur Rashid and

directed by Faiz Zahir, the play essentially is about the partition of Bengal (Bongobhongo) of 1905, although it is never portrayed concretely. Instead, it shows life on the border of the Benapole-Haridaspur land port border between Bangladesh and India. Characters

like smugglers, human traffickers, drug addicts and a prostitute are developed initially in the play, alongside customs officers and authority and law enforcement figures. The arrival of a mysterious man, held after trying to cross the borders, causes tensions to rise on both sides and borders to be closed, stranding people on both sides. The mysterious man is metaphorically portrayed as Rabindranath Tagore (or his spirit), and the rise in tensions eventually cause political intervention, and a shootout leaves two lovers, who lived on either side of the barbed wire, dead on their grounds.

Acting was good across the board, as is expected of Aranyak, and the script has its moments too, but in

entirety, the play remains on the obscure side. Although director Faiz Zahir said at the Rongo Adda -- a post-staging Q&A session with the director -- a lot of the play was left for audience's interpretations; the clarity of the plot itself seemed to be off at times. The set design fits well, but is not all too striking; the music is placed well but is a little one dimensional, with only percussive sounds. A number of Tagore songs are used, tying to the presence of Tagore in the play. The choreography was often predictable and purposeless, despite having its moments. The use of a third-person narrator on-stage nearly the entire time was a nice touch, while the costume, props and light were also done neatly.

be able to choose from the spices and not any major ingredient.


