Strike at twin US ports slows Bangladesh shipments

Garment shipments from Bangladesh to the US have been facing troubles over the last three weeks because of a strike by workers at the twin ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach.

In the worst shipping crisis in a decade in the United States, mammoth vessels loaded with products destined for American stores are sitting idle just off the coast, waiting for cargo languishing on the docks to clear.

Workers under the International Longshore and Warehouse Union (ILWU) that deals with all port activities in west coast of the US went on strike demanding renewal of their contracts signed with the Pacific Maritime Association (PMA).

Most of the renowned global retailers that source garment from Bangladesh think the strike would hamper timely storage of the goods to be sold in the upcoming holiday season, mainly in December.

On October 20, more than 101 US industry associations, including manufacturers, farmers and agribusinesses, wholesalers, retailers, importers, exporters, distributors and transportation and logistics providers, sent a letter to ILWU and PMA.

In the letter, they urged the PMA and ILWU to launch negotiation between the two to remove the impasse.

If the situation does not improve soon, the shipments of apparel items from Bangladesh will be hampered badly, said Atiqul Islam, president of Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association.

Currently, Bangladesh exports more than \$5 billion of garment items to the US market.

The delays are affecting JC Penney, Macy's, Kohl's Corp, Nordstrom Inc, American Eagle, Ralph Lauren and Carter's, according to Reuters.

China shows the way for poverty cuts

Analysts explain how radical reforms, market-oriented ideas paid off in China

China has made extraordinary progress in lifting people out of poverty because of its pro-people policies and political commitment towards development, analysts said yesterday.

They made the observation at South-South Dialogue at Dhaka University, highlighting poverty reduction experiences of China and its relevance to South Asia. ActionAid Bangladesh and The Daily Star co-organised the event that was attended by two scholars from China, among others.

Zuo Ting, a professor at College of faster, he added. Humanities and Development of China Agricultural University, said China has lifted 68 crore out of poverty between 1981 and 2010. The country has brought down its poverty rate to less than 8 percent now from 84 percent in 1981.

Prof Ting said this poverty reduction was possible because of the government's active roles and its priority on development issues. Radical reforms and market oriented ideas

helped the country reduce poverty

Outlining the development process into three phases, Ting said people got land ownership from landlords during the revolutionary era (1947-1978). He termed 1978 to 1997 as the reform era, when the country updated its policies and strategies to grow faster economically.

The third phase, which begain in 1997, was the era of urbanisation, he said. In this phase, China is extending social support to modern people.

It is often said that from tiny acorns, mighty oaks grow, and this could very well sum up the narrative of Qualitex Group, the 2011 winner of the HSBC Export Excellence Award.

In 1989, with a monthly capacity of mere 40,000 pounds, Qualitex Group set up a plant at Chittagong Export Processing Zone.

In a space of 25 years, it has gone on to become the country's largest terry towel exporter, with big names like Wal-Mart, Ikea and Carrefour as its clients. Two years ago, the company was renamed as Premier 1888 Ltd.

Today, it has six composite factories at the zone, which add up to a monthly capacity of upwards of 3 million pounds, enough to account for more than half of the country's towel export volume, according to its General Manger for accounts and finance Lalith Nandana Wijekoon.

Its sales turnover last year stood at \$81.61 million, a nearly four-fold increase from 2003.

The key to the company's success has been high-quality assurance, competitive pricing and timely delivery, Wijekoon told The Daily Star in an interview last week.

Rent collection through bank accounts fails to take off: Muhith

The initiative to get tenants pay their rent through a separate bank account has failed owing to political pressure, Finance Minister AMA Muhith said yesterday.

"Politics is a game of compromise. Everyone started to oppose the initiative and I had to backtrack from my stance," Muhith told reporters after a meeting with Lynne Featherstone, UK parliamentary under secretary of state for international development, at his secretariat office.

However, an initiative will be taken next year to implement it, he added.

In this year's budget, Muhith had proposed to make it mandatory for landlords to open separate bank accounts to collect their rents.

But the provision was dropped when the budget was passed. Muhith said the National Board of Revenue has prepared a list of homeowners and all of them will have to pay taxes.


