Unidentified criminals abducted a boy from his Kapashatia village residence in Harinakundo upazila of Jhenidah on Thursday night.

Son of Murad Ali, an expatriate in Malaysia, Hasan Ali, 13, is a JSC examinee of Valki Secondary School in the upazila.

A gang of five to six abductors wearing masks entered the house and picked up Hasan at gunpoint while he was asleep with his mother Anjira Khatun, said his uncle Younus Ali.

When Anjira tried to resist the culprits, they pushed her away, he said. A case was filed with Harinakundo Police

Station. Officer-in-Charge Ershadul Kabir said they were investigating the

incident.

Says Fakhrul

Referring to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's remarks on Thursday that parliamentary election can be held anytime in a democracy, BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday said the government had begun to bow to his party and people's demand for an immediate national election under a non-party caretaker government.

He was addressing a press conference after a joint meeting at the party's Nayapaltan central office in the capital, a day after the PM briefed on her recent trip to the United Arab Emirates.

In the UAE, Hasina told the media, "According to the constitution, the government's tenure is five years. The election can be held anytime in a democracy and the government has every right to hold it anytime. But I am saying the election will be held at the right time."

Approval must to prevent unplanned urbanisation

Speakers tell seminar marking first World Cities Day

Immediate government approval of the draft National Urban Sector Policy is a prerequisite to safeguarding the country from unplanned urbanisation, speakers told a seminar yesterday.

"Around 4.5 crore people live in urban areas, their contribution to the GDP (gross domestic product) measures 60 to 65 percent which can be raised to 70 to 75 percent through planned urbanisation," said urban planning expert Prof Nazrul Islam.

The main objectives of the policy, prepared in 2011, includes ensuring balanced urbanisation, economic development, employment generation, optimum use of land, environment protection, strengthening of local governments, an inclusive decision making process, need-based services, community development, preservation of historical and cultural heritage and reducing poverty.

The Municipal Association of Bangladesh organised the seminar in the capital's Cirdap auditorium in observance of the first World Cities Day 2014.

Themed "Better City, Better Life", the United Nations established the day aiming to promote the international community's interest in global urbanisation, push forward cooperation in meeting opportunities and challenges and contribute to sustainable urban development.


Kathin Chibar Dan Utsab (annual robe offering ceremony), a major religious festival of the Buddhist community, ended in Rangamati hill town yesterday.

3 wildcats, 10 doves seized in capital

Three fishing cats (locally known as Mechho Biral) and eight Eurasian collared doves and two common emerald doves were seized from a dairy farm in Beribandh area in the capital's Mohammadpur yesterday.

Wildlife Management and Nature Conservation Department, and Wildlife Crime Control Unit recovered them from Jakir Dairy Farm, said Ashim Mollick, wildlife inspector of the unit.


6,000 DU students likely to get loan to buy laptops BSS, Dhaka

The government is considering providing loans to 6,000 first-year students of Dhaka University (DU) to buy laptops at a low interest rate to help them acquire ICT knowledge.

During a meeting, **Education Secretary Nazrul** Islam Khan discussed the matter with DU Vice-Chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique and Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr Atiur Rahman at the VC's office on October 27. The education secretary assured of becoming the guarantor against the loan, to be provided under a credit programme of Bangladesh Bank.

This is a very good initiative and Dhaka University is very keen to introduce such loans through which students can get an opportunity to establish a knowledge-based society, said Prof Arefin. Dr Atiur Rahman has

shown interest to introduce refinance schemes in the bank to provide laptop loans at 9 percent interest.
