**Sachin could have quit earlier!**

He might be revered as the 'God of Cricket' but there was a phase in Sachin Tendulkar's awe-inspiring career when the batting maestro felt so "scarred" and "devastated" by the Indian team's ineptitude under his captaincy that he wanted to completely move away from the sport.

The 41-year-old former batsman has finally opened up about the dark days he survived in a career which spanned nearly two-and-a-half decades in his autobiography 'Playing It My Way', to be released worldwide on November 6.

"I hated losing and as captain of the team I felt responsible for the string of miserable performances. More worryingly, I did not know how I could turn it around, as I was already trying my absolute best," recalls Tendulkar in the book, the first exclusive excerpts of which are with PTI.

"I confided in [wife] Anjali that I feared there was nothing more that I could do to stem the tide of defeats. Losing a string of very close matches had left me badly scarred. I had given it everything and was not sure that I could give even 0.1 per cent more."

"...It was hurting me badly and it took me a long time to come to terms with these failures. I even contemplated moving away from the sport completely, as it seemed nothing was going my way," reveals the diminutive right-hander in the much-awaited book co-authored by noted sports journalist and historian Boria Majumdar.

**Juventus on top again**

Champions Juventus restored their three-point lead at the top of Serie A on Saturday with a 2-0 win at struggling Empoli.

Andrea Pirlo and Alvaro Morata got the goals for Juve in the space of 11 second-half minutes in the first meeting between the two sides since 2008.

Parma, meanwhile, moved off the bottom of the table with a shock 2-0 home win over Inter, who thus maintained their record of never winning three games consecutively under coach Walter Mazzarri.

Midfielder Paolo De Ceglie grabbed both goals for Roberto Donadoni's side, in the fifth and 76th minutes to secure the team's second win of the season. Roma slipped up yesterday, costing the lead.

**PSG close in on Marseille**

Unbeaten Paris Saint Germain drew to within a single point of Ligue 1 leaders Marseille on Saturday with a come-from-behind 2-1 win at Lorient.

Lorient stunned the champions with Raphael Guerreiro's tight shot opening the scoring on 42 minutes.

But Paris came back early in the second-half with goals from Edinson Cavani and substitute Jean-Christophe Bahebeck.

Marseille, who lost at Lyon last weekend, have 25 points ahead of their home game with Lens on Sunday and PSG have 24, as these two giants of French football get ready to go head-to-head in Paris next weekend.

**Wanderers win AFC CL**

Western Sydney Wanderers became the first Australian side to win the Asian Champions League title on Saturday after a goalless draw against Saudi giants Al Hilal gave them a 1-0 aggregate win in the final.

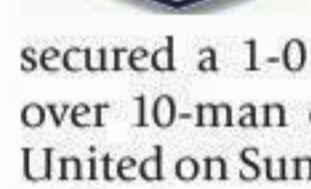
The Aussie side's victory stunned into silence the 65,000 Al Hilal supporters inside the King Fahd International Stadium, most of whom had turned out in the host team's blue and white colours.

The win was a shot in the arm for the Wanderers who came into existence only two years ago and had survived some tough games in the tournament to reach the final.

The Sydney club walked away with the trophy despite getting only one clear shot at goal, which was saved Al Hilal by goalkeeper Abdulla al-Sdairy.

**City's derby delight Barca slip to third**

Manchester City reasserted themselves as the dominant local force as Sergio Agüero's second-half goal secured a 1-0 Premier League victory over 10-man derby rivals Manchester United on Sunday.

Both managers had claimed in the build-up to the game that their team was the biggest in the city, but it was Manuel Pellegrini's City who prevailed after Chris Smalling's brainless first-half dismissal handed them control.

The United centre-back saw two yellow cards after trying to block a clearance by Joe Hart and then fouling James Milner, and after seeing three penalty appeals waved away, City eventually took the spoils thanks to Agüero.

The Argentine's 63rd-minute strike ended a run of three winless games for City, who climbed back to within six points of leaders Chelsea ahead of Wednesday's crucial Champions League meeting with CSKA Moscow.

Victory gave third-place City a fourth consecutive league win over their neighbours for the first time since 1970, and left Louis van Gaal's United seven points behind the champions in ninth place.

To compound matters, United lost centre-back Marcos Rojo to a shoulder

injury in the second half, but Van Gaal will have drawn encouragement from his side's dogged showing on a ground where they lost 4-1 last season.

City were missing the injured David Silva and received a late blow when Aleksandar Kolarov was forced to withdraw from the starting XI after injuring himself in the warm-up, with Gael Clichy coming in.

Angel di Maria twice forced City back with crosses from wide on the left, but from the first Adnan Januzaj sliced off target and from the second Robin van Persie headed wide.

Beneath autumnal sunshine, it was a bitty start to the game, but mid-way through the first half the home team came to life and De Gea was obliged to ride to United's rescue three times in quick succession.

United weathered the storm, but they gifted City the momentum when Smalling was needlessly sent off in the 39th minute.

Having received a first booking for standing in front of Hart as the City goalkeeper looked to launch a clearance, he foolishly flew in on Milner, leaving referee Michael Oliver with no option but to dismiss him.

United's ensuing reorganisation saw Januzaj concede his place to Michael Carrick, who made his first appearance of the season.

It could have been even worse for United, but Oliver twice rejected strong penalty appeals from City -- the first when Marouane Fellaini kicked the back of Agüero's foot, the second when Rojo clattered Yaya Toure from behind as the Ivorian sought to bring down a high ball.

United were forced into another defensive reshuffle early in the second period when Rojo had to be stretchered off and given oxygen after injuring his shoulder in a sliding challenge. Paddy McNair took his place.

Agüero saw another penalty shout ignored after being clipped by Carrick, but City's persistence paid off in the 63rd minute.

Toure found Clichy with a beautifully weighted pass down the inside-left channel and the Frenchman crossed for Agüero to sweep home left-footed from 10 yards.

With the home fans scenting blood, City manager Pellegrini sent on Samir Nasri and Edin Dzeko for the final 20 minutes.

Navas hit the post after a scuttling run but United finished the game strongly, with Hart blocking from Van Persie and getting down well to save a low right-foot shot by Di Maria after a bulldozing Rooney run.

Toure almost made the game safe, heading over in injury time, but Agüero's goal proved enough.

Luis Suarez's Barcelona home debut ended in a shock defeat as Joaquin Larrivey's solitary strike handed Celta Vigo a famous 1-0 win at the Camp Nou.

Real Madrid took advantage of Barcelona's slip-up to move top of the table as they continued their free-scoring form with a 4-0 thrashing of Granada earlier on Saturday and champions Atletico Madrid are up to second as they eased past Cordoba 4-2 at home. Just as in his debut defeat against Real at the Bernabeu last weekend, Suarez was left frustrated as Barca hit the woodwork four times and were denied on several more occasions by fine saves from Celta goalkeeper Sergio Alvarez.

Neymar smashed an early dipping shot off the crossbar, but Celta were enjoying plenty of the ball and could easily have gone in front if they hadn't been so wasteful with the final ball.

Barca began to get going midway through the first-half and only a stunning save from Alvarez prevented Lionel Messi equalling the record as La Liga's all-time leading scorer as his first time hit from Neymar's cut-back was turned behind.

Even when Messi did beat the Celta 'keeper moments later he was denied as Jonny made an incredible sliding clearance with a touch of fortune as the ball ricocheted to safety off his own crossbar.

Barca boss Luis Enrique introduced Xavi and Pedro in an attempt to turn the game around and from the latter's cross Suarez had a golden opportunity to open his account for the club when he headed straight into the arms of Alvarez.

And they needed one last miracle from Alvarez to seal the three points as he turned behind a fierce effort from Suarez five minutes from time.

Sevilla passed up the chance to move top of La Liga as they were beaten 1-0 away to Athletic Bilbao thanks to Aritz Aduriz's stunning early strike.

Barcelona's shock defeat had paved the way for Unai Emery's men to take top spot, but they were behind after just 12 minutes when Aduriz smacked home Markel Susaeta's cross.

The Basques held firm in the second-half to record their second consecutive win and move up to 11th in the table.

Defeat leaves Sevilla in fourth, level on points with Barca and two adrift of leaders Real Madrid.

Atletico continued their own four-match winning run going as Antoine Griezmann struck his first two league goals for the club to help Atletico to a 4-2 win over Cordoba.

**Bayern overcome D'mund**

Arjen Robben converted a late penalty on Saturday as Bundesliga leaders Bayern Munich claimed a 2-1 victory over Borussia Dortmund, who have now lost their last five league matches.

The defeat leaves Dortmund 16th in the table and amongst the relegation places as Robben scored his sixth goal in his last six games against Borussia to add to their misery.

With seven points from their first ten Bundesliga games it is the worst start to a league season in Dortmund's history.

They are also the only team in Germany's top flight to have lost seven games this season.

Marco Reus gave Dortmund a first-half lead only for Bayern's striker Robert Lewandowski to score against his old club before Robben converted an 85th-minute penalty.

The Allianz Arena clash got off to a frantic start as Robben and Dortmund's Henrikh Mkhitaryan both clipped the woodwork in the opening five minutes.

Reus, who Bayern chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge has admitted Munich want to sign at the end of the season, headed home an inch-perfect Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang cross on 31 minutes.

But with the lion's share of possession, Bayern battered the Dortmund defence and their goalkeeper Roman Weidenfeller kept Borussia in the match with a string of saves.

The hosts drew level when Lewandowski snapped up a loose ball on the edge of the area and drove his shot inside the far post on 72 minutes.

Robben then broke Dortmund hearts when he converted a penalty after Borussia centre-back Neven Subotic held back Bayern wing Franck Ribery in the area.

The win keeps Bayern four points clear and there is now a huge 17-point gap between

Bayern and Dortmund in the table. Earlier, VfL Wolfsburg climbed to second with a 4-0 hammering of VfB Stuttgart as ex-Chelsea midfielder Kevin de Bruyne shone.

De Bruyne netted his first goal of the season and created another two as Wolves picked up their sixth straight win in all competitions.
