Reigning champions Real Madrid, Arsenal and Borussia Dortmund can all qualify for the last 16 of the Champions League on Tuesday.

MALMO V ATLETICO MADRID

Atletico can close in on a place in the last 16 with a third consecutive win in Group A when they go to Sweden to face the section's bottom club. The reigning Spanish champions have won their last four games, including a 5-0 thumping of Malmo two weeks ago and a 4-2 defeat of Cordoba on Saturday which featured a brace from Antoine Griezmann and lifted them within a point of top spot in La Liga.

JUVENTUS V OLYMPIAKOS

This encounter in Turin has the makthree points clear at the top of Serie A but have struggled to transform their domestic form onto the European stage and were beaten 1-0 at Olympiakos in their last outing. Having collected just three points from three games in Group A, Massimiliano Allegri's side will be staring elimination in the face if they suffer another defeat at home to the Greek titleholders, and their situation would not be helped if Atletico were to win in Malmo.

BASEL V LUDOGORETS RAZGRAD

Second place behind Real Madrid appears to be up for grabs in Group B after Ludogorets beat Basel 1-0 last

time out. Now the sides meet again in BENFICA VAS MONACO Switzerland, where Paulo Sousa's side have a good record in Europe, including beating Liverpool last month.

REAL MADRID V LIVERPOOL

Reigning European champions Madrid will qualify for the last 16 with a victory at home to Liverpool, who they outclassed 3-0 at Anfield two weeks ago. Few would bet against Carlo Ancelotti's side recording another comfortable win at the Santiago Bernabeu given the respective form of the two sides just now. Real turned on the style to win 4-0 at Granada on Saturday, their 11th consecutive win taking them top of La Liga. Gareth Bale, who has sat out his muscle injury, has returned to training health just now as they look to extend beat Borussia Dortmund. ings of a decisive encounter. Juve are their 18-game unbeaten run at home in the Champions League.

In contrast, Liverpool need a boost after a 1-0 defeat at Newcastle United in the Premier League on Saturday.

ZENIT ST PETERSBURG V BAYER LEVERKUSEN

While Zenit are flying at home, the meeting with Bayer Leverkusen at the Petrovski Stadium could be decisive for them. Andre Villas-Boas's side are unbeaten in the Russian Premier League this season. However, having lost 2-0 when the teams clashed in Germany a fortnight ago, another defeat Tuesday would leave them five points behind the Bundesliga side in Group C.

RONALDO eyeing Raul's record

Cristiano Ronaldo needs one goal to match the Champions League's all-time leading scorer when Real Madrid hosts Liverpool on Tuesday.

At the rate the forward is sweeping in goals, Ronaldo has a good chance to match and even break Raul Gonzalez's mark of 71 goals in front of the same Santiago Bernabeu crowd that used to chant Raul's name.

Madrid would qualify for the knockout rounds with a second straight win over Liverpool in Group B.

Ronaldo is doing his best to erase memories of Portugal's poor showing at this year's World Cup and boost his chances of winning a second consecutive Ballon d'Or. Ronaldo has scored in 12 straight appearances in all competi-

tions for Madrid. His goal on Saturday, which sparked a 4-0 rout at Granada on Saturday, made him the first Madrid player to score in eight consecutive Spanish league appearances. He leads the Spanish league with 17 goals and has 22 overall for

his club, including the one he scored last month to set Madrid on its way to a commanding 3-0 win at Liverpool. Ronaldo will also have the extra motivation of not giving Lionel

Messi the chance to reach Raul's record first. Messi has 69 goals heading into Barcelona's match at Ajax on Wednesday.

Liverpool was outclassed in the first meeting and will face an even tougher task with Madrid playing its best football since the arrival of coach Carlo Ancelotti last season.

Five in a row for Hamilton

Lewis Hamilton increased his lead in the world championship to 24 points on Sunday when he swept to his fifth consecutive victory and 10th of the season by winning an intriguing United States Grand Prix.

The 29-year-old Briton,

who started second behind his pole sitting Mercedes team-mate and nearest rival Nico Rosberg, took the lead with a bold move after 24 laps on his way to a perfectly-measured triumph ahead of the German by nearly five seconds. It was the 32nd win of

Hamilton's career, a landmark statistic that lifted him one victory clear of Nigel Mansell as the British driver with most career successes in Formula One. It was also his second

victory in three races at the Circuit of the Americas. Hamilton now has 316

points to Rosberg's 292 following the Englishman's dominant success earned by clever tyre preservation tactics with two races remaining, including the final race in Abu Dhabi where double points are scored.
