

Poor show in education

Study reveals most school students' lack of competence in 3 major subjects

Around 92 percent of sixth graders don't have the required competence in English, and 89 percent of them lack proficiency in Bangla, according to a government survey.

The picture is also dismal in the case of mathematics as more than 82 percent of them cannot gain expected competence in the subject, shows the Learning Assessment Survey-2013.


It, however, found that class-VIII students did better than sixth graders. Around 23 percent of the eighth graders achieved the desired level of competence in English and 38 percent in Bangla. In mathematics, 22 percent of the students gained com-

petence, mentions the survey report launched at a national workshop at the National Academy for Educational Management in the capital yesterday. The findings come amid growing concern over the stan-

dard of education following abysmal results in recentlyheld admission tests at Dhaka University. Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Wing of the

Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education (DSHE) conducted the survey with financial assistance from the DSHE's Secondary Education Quality and Access Enhancement Project (SEQAEP).

Security not an issue for them now

Defence counsels went to Dhaka Central Jail yesterday to meet death row war crimes convict Muhammad Kamaruzzaman, ignoring the "security issues" they had been citing as reasons for their absence from the trial proceedings on hartal

In 2012 and last year, senior defence lawyers did not attend the two international crimes tribunals on hartal days, even after repeated assurances from the courts that they would be provided with necessary

On several occasions, the tribunals imposed fines on them but they continued remaining absent, delaying the court procedures.

However, lawyers of Jamaat-e-Islami leader Kamaruzzaman went to meet him in jail in an ambulance braving the hartal that

She was speaking at a meeting with the high officials of the disaster management and relief ministry at Bangladesh Secretariat.

The Rohingya refugees will be shifted to a wider area as they are now living in a very inhumane condition, PM's Press Secretary AKM Shameem Chowdhury told newsmen


