REMARKS ON BANGABANDHU

Tarique sued for 'sedition,' served legal notice

A Supreme Court lawyer yesterday served a legal notice on BNP senior vicechairman Tarique Rahman, asking him to apologise unconditionally to the nation for calling Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman "Pakbandhu" (friend of Pakistan). In the notice, Momtaz

Uddin Ahmed Mehedi said Tarique reportedly told a BNP meeting in London on November 5 that Mujib was a friend of Pakistan and that a sedition case should be filed against Bangabandhu since he returned to Bangladesh with a Pakistani passport. Such remarks tantamount to sedition, he wrote.

Tarique, who has been in London since 2008, also said Mujib took oath as president of Bangladesh being a Pakistani citizen.

The legal notice asks Tarique to withdraw the "unsolicited", "unconstitutional", "non-political", "undemocratic", and "indecent" statement within seven days. Otherwise, a criminal case will be filed against him, it says.

The notice was sent by post to BNP's Nayapaltan central office and Gulshan residence of Khaleda Zia, Tarique's mother. Meanwhile, a sedition

case was filed against Tarique in Jessore yesterday for his November 5 remarks about Bangabandhu, reports our Jessore correspondent. SM Afzal Hossain, organ-

ising secretary of Jessore district Awami League, filed the case with the judicial magistrate's court.

The court took the case into cognisance and fixed November 13 for hearing.

BEGUM ROKEYA UNIVERSITY 10 teachers quit from administrative posts

Protest 'deprivation' from promotion

Ten teachers of Begum Rokeya University, Rangpur (BRUR) resigned from 19 administrative posts yesterday for being "deprived" of overdue promotion and related benefits.

However, they will continue their academic activities. Morshed-ul-Alam Rony, acting registrar, said he received their resignation letters.

Dr RM Hafizur Rahman, associate professor of mathematics, who resigned as dean of the science faculty, provost of Shaheed Muktar Elahi Hall, and heads of mathematics, physics, and computer science departments, said he was entitled to professorship more than two years back.

He said many more teachers were deprived of promotion like him.

Meanwhile, some of the 27 teachers who were promoted to assistant professors on September 30, resigned from their administrative posts, demanding arrears for the period since they were entitled to the promotion around two years ago, said Assistant Prof of political science Saidur Rahman, who resigned as assistant provost of Sheikh Fazilatunnesa Mujib Hall.
