









Lobbying door to door for a job is not dignified for an educated person.




Prof Zillur's burial today

New 'cantonment' by Padma bridge

Govt to divert development fund for it; army seeks 326-acre land

The government has decided to build a new cantonment at the Padma Bridge project site and the army has sought Tk 1,774 crore over four years to build the security installations for the bridge.

The government is going to divert money from sluggish and low-priority development projects to fund the construction of the new cantonment.

Planning Minister AHM Mostafa Kamal had a meeting with high officials of the Bridges Division and top Bangladesh Army officers yesterday where they decided to form a committee for managing the funds.

The committee, comprising secretaries of planning, high officials of the Bridges Division and high-ranking army officers, would identify the projects that would have their funds diverted and figure out other ways to fund the cantonment construction.

The army had previously sought Tk 1,200 crore for the same cantonment but the cost went up due to high prices of land and cost of land development.

Google bus starts journey

Targets reaching 5 lakh students of 480 colleges, universities for workshop on internet use

Search engine giant Google yesterday launched its "Google Bus" project in Bangladesh to train five lakh undergrads on the use of the internet.

The Google Bus will visit 480 colleges and universities in 35 locations across the country for a year to conduct workshops for the students who registered to participate, said State Minister for ICT Zunaid Ahmed Palak.

Inaugurating the project at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the capital, Palak said Google will launch its "street view" of Dhaka and Chittagong cities within the next two months.

Through the Google Bus workshops, students will be connected online with their peers and learn


about the power and usefulness of the internet as well as expose themselves to Google tools that can help them

think and operate on a new level. Regarding the lack of interest in using the internet, the state minister said he himself had signed 1,500 letters requesting school authorities to be a part of the project, but only

480 schools agreed to take part. SEE PAGE 2 COL 6

KHOKON RAZAKAR Verdict in war crimes case today

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 is set to deliver today verdict in the case against fugitive BNP leader MA Zahid Hossain Khokon in connection with crimes against humanity and genocide committed in Faridpur during the


Liberation War in 1971. "Let the case be fixed tomorrow for the delivery of judgement," said Justice M Enayetur Rahim, chairman of the three-member tribunal, yesterday.

Trial against the 70-yearold war crimes accused, who is assumed to have fled the country and been living in Sweden, has been held in absentia.

Khokon is allegedly involved in killing at least 50 people, injuring eight, raping two women, forcing
