Cold water poured on savings of low earners

For years, Ferdousi Khatun has toiled as a maid shuttling between houses to make a living.

In the hope of securing a better life for her three children, she saved penny by penny from her meagre income, and was able to have a deposit of Tk 1 lakh at a Satkhira branch of a state-run bank.

But her savings will not be spared by tax officials despite the fact that her income is tax-free.

Worse still, unlike the TIN (tax identification number) holders who pay 10 percent of the profits on savings in advance income tax, she will lose 15 percent of the profits for not having TIN.

"I have never heard of it [TIN]. Where would I get that? I can hardly run my family with the money I earn. Where will I get money to pay tax?" asked the poor woman.

Of the 16 crore people in the country, only 10 lakh submit ax returns.

In 1999, the government started collecting 10 percent tax from profits on savings and pension schemes of 1.5 crore savers, including 1 crore small depositors, said officials at Bangladesh Bank and the NBR.

A provision was introduced in July 2012, stipulating that account holders without TIN must pay 15 percent of the SEE PAGE 2 COL 4

Weekends usually bring a little relief to city residents from traffic jams. But that was not to be yesterday.

It took college student Nima Khan over one and a half hours to reach Farmgate from Motijheel in the afternoon, thanks to a huge traffic jam caused by a Jubo League rally at the city's Suhrawardy Udyan.

Buses, cars, and other modes of transport had to wait even up to an hour at Shahbagh, Bangla Motor, Farmgate, Moghbazar, Press Club, High Court, Gulistan, Bijoy Sarani, Katabon, Sonargaon and Ruposhi Bangla intersections, to the woes of commuters.

From main thoroughfares, traffic jam spread to the adjacent lanes and by-lanes.

## Lalon-loving RU teacher killed

'Militant group' claims responsibility on Facebook

A Rajshahi University professor was hacked to death by unidentified criminals near his house in Choddopai area on the outskirts of the city yesterday afternoon.

AKM Shafiul Islam, 48, a teacher of sociology, died after an emergency surgery around 4:45pm at the Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Brain damage and profuse bleeding from multiple stabbings in the neck and head led to his death, said RMCH Director Brig Gen Nasir Uddin.

A gang of four attacked him at the entrance of Bihas residential area around 3:00pm while he was returning home by his motorbike, said Alamgir Hossain, OC of Motihar police station.

In a late development, an Islamist group calling itself Mujahideen fi Sabilillah has claimed the responsibility for Shafiul's murder in a post on its Facebook page Ansar Al Islam Bangladesh-2.

#### Like immature boy Joy talks Says Fakhrul
