Compensation hard to get

Families suffer for govt's lack of coordination

US President Barack Obama yesterday

warned of the dangers of outright

conflict in Asia, as China squares off

against rival claimants over disputed

territories, but vowed that Washington

would remain anchored in the region.

Families of at least 6,000 expatriates who died abroad in accidents are yet to receive compensations even after years of waiting. And a lack of coordination among the government agencies concerned is mainly blamed for this.

Officials of the Bangladesh missions in different labour receiving countries, however, blamed legal complexities in those countries as well.

Omar Faruk of Laxmipur's Charvoga village went to Saudi Arabia in 2001, leaving his seven-month-pregnant wife at home, in search of a better luck. But only 47 days after his arrival in the Gulf state, he was killed in a

His wife did not receive any compensation in the last 13 years, though she submitted all necessary documents to get it.

Having lost the sole breadwinner of the family, the widow, Shahina Yasmin, and her three children had been living on her parents' assistance and charities of their neighbours all these years.

"In the last 13 years, we didn't get any compensation. In 2009, I sent all the required papers to the authorities concerned, but we are yet to get anything -- either from the government or from the Saudi employer," Shahina told The Daily Star last week.

Halima Akhter of Manikganj's Singair upazila has been waiting for compensation since her husband Yunus Ali died in a lorry crash in Saudi Arabia in 2006.

"For the last eight years, I have been trying to secure compensations so that I can bring up my little son properly. But now I'm very frustrated and dismayed over the hassles that I have been going through in the process," she told The Daily Star recently.

"I didn't marry again, considering my son's well-being ... But I'm getting tired now," Halima said with a sigh.

2 brothers abducted in city

Gunmen abducted two brothers at Bholartek in the capital's Darussalam early Friday.

Omar Faruk, 32, and Firoz, 27, were picked by a group around 10 people around 2:30am, said their father Hakim Ali.

"They came in a microbus and hit the front door of my house so hard that they nearly broke it. When I opened the door, four to five men barged in, went to Faruk's room, dragged him out and bundled him onto the microbus," he added.

When Hakim asked them about their identities and the reason for the raid, they replied, "Old man, you will know about it later."

About six to seven armed men were waiting outside the house. When Hakim came out of the house a little later, he heard that the gang also picked up his younger son Firoz, who lives next door.

The two brothers have been running a bookshop, Nobojatra Library, in the city's Nilkhet for the last sixseven years. They were not
