the slain professor.

"He was progressive but never involved in politics. He preached humanism. This is what the radicals like Jamaat-Shibir men did not like and these are the people who killed him," Javin said over the phone from their ancestral home in Gaibandha where his father was buried yester-

Prof Shafiul, 48, was hacked to death by unknown assailants near his house in Choddopai area on the outskirts of the city on Saturday.

Hours after the killing a group calling itself Ansar Al Islam Bangladesh-2 claimed responsibility for the murder in a post on its Facebook page.

20 DETAINED In Rajshahi, law enforcers detained 20

people, including a local Jamaat-e-Islami leader, in connection with the murder.

Jamaat leader Humayun Kabir, principal of the city's Islamia College, was arrested in Binodpur area. He coordinated many of Jamaat-Shibir's violent activities in Motihar Thana area, said AKM Nahidul Islam, deputy commissioner (East) of Rajshahi Metropolitan Police (RMP).

Police did not disclose the identities of the others detained after RU Registrar Prof Entajul Haque filed a murder case with Motihar Police Station.

DC Nahidul said the murder was planned and the detainees were being interrogated.

"Shafiul's faith in Baul philosophy and his close association with bauls might have angered Jamaat-Shibir men and like-minded militant outfits," he said.

On the claims of the so-called Ansar Al Islam Bangladesh-2, Nahidul said police are investigating it. "We have already sent a letter to police headquarters for investigating those web

materials." However, the group's claim might be a ploy to divert attention from the real killers, he suspected. "It may be the

case that members of another group have done it but they are trying to pass the blame on to a fabricated outfit."

Joint Commissioner Monirul Islam of the Detective Branch of Dhaka Metropolitan Police said: "The group might be one of the splinter cells of militant group Ansarullah Bangla Team which carried out many secret killings."

However, echoing Nahidul, he also said the real killers might create the Facebook page to hide themselves.

RU Vice-Chancellor Prof Muhammad Mizanuddin, too, said it was a planned murder.

"The university authorities have asked law enforcers to arrest the killers immediately," he said. "A GOOD SOUL"

On the Facebook page, Shafiul Islam was termed "murtad" (atheist). The group which claimed the responsibility for the killing, referred to a Daily Sangram report that Shafiul had banned burka in his class when he was the chairman of Sociology department

"Allahu Akbar! Allahu Akbar! Our Mujahideens today have murdered a murtad [atheist] who had prohibited female students from wearing burka [veil] in classrooms," says one of the posts on the page.

In a fresh post yesterday, the militant outfit also termed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina "murtad" and said Shafiul was a greater "murtad" than

Feraun and Hasina. Shafiul's colleague Prof Mustafijur Rahman, however, said Shafiul never showed any disrespect towards his students' beliefs or attires.

"Shafiul was obsessed with Sufism and the mystical beliefs of Lalon. We've never heard of any student complaining against him. He was loved by all,"

PROTESTS AT RU & DU Outraged by the killing, RU teachers yesterday boycotted classes and examinations while Dhaka university teachers staged demonstrations demanding immediate arrest and exemplary pun-

ishment of the killers.

Over a thousand teachers, students and university staffs brought out a silent procession wearing black badges in front of the RU Senate Bhaban at 11:15am.

"We, the teachers, are not safe at all," said Prof Shamsul Alam Sarker.

Demanding immediate arrest of the killers, RU Teachers Association announced that all classes and exams would be boycotted today and tomorrow. They also warned of tougher programmes if law enforcers failed to submit the charge sheet in 15 days.

In a protest rally on the DU campus, Prof Akhter Sultana, chair of Mass Communication and Journalism department, said if the killers went unpunished, such incidents would continue to happen.

Different student organisations brought out processions both on RU and DU campuses, demanding arrest and punishment of the killers.

AUTOPSY REPORT

The Forensic department of Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH) yesterday submitted Shafiul's autopsy report to the police, calling it a homicide from fatal head injuries.

"We found five fatal injuries in his head and neck from sharp-edged weapons," said Assistant Prof Jubaidur

Rahman of the RMCH. 3 RU TEACHERS KILLED

IN A DECADE

With Prof Shafiul, three RU teachers were killed in the last ten years.

Muhammad Yunus, a professor of Economics, was killed at Binodpur on December 24, 2004. On January 28, 2010, a lower court sentenced two JMB men to death in the case.

On February 1, 2006, Prof Sheikh Taher Ahmed, 59, of Geology and Mining department was murdered inside his residence on the campus. A Rajshahi speedy trial tribunal awarded death penalty to four people, including a pro Jamaat-e-Islami teacher Mia Mohammad Moinuddin of the university, in May 2008 for the

The dead are Nayek Subedar Mohammad Abul Kashem and Sepoy Mohammad Hasan. They are members of 16 BGB Battalion in Ramgarh of the district.

Lt Col Khaled Bin Yusuf, commanding officer of the battalion, said the explosion took place around 11:25am when a regular training of the BGB members was going on.

While Nayek Hasan was trying to throw a grenade, it went off in his hand as he could not handle it properly. The blast killed Sepoy Kashem, who was very close to Hasan, on the spot and injured four others, said the BGB official.

Hasan died when he was taken to Combined Military Hospital in Dhaka by a helicopter, Khaled added.

The injured -- Capt Tayeful, Nayek Subedar Md Masud, Lance Corporal Md Siraj and Sepoy Moshirul -- have been undergoing treatment at the same hospital.

started looking for his mobile phone and seized his wife's, said Shirin.

They kept beating Faruk till he gave away his phone, which was put on charge at a neighbour's house, she said adding that after getting their hands on the cell phone, the men left with the brothers.

By then, all the residents of the two buildings had woken up. They all watched the gunmen taking away Faruk and Firoz. Except for the two cellphones, they

took nothing else, said the family members. However, Officer-in-Charge Rafiqul

Islam of Darussalam Police Station said they still didn't know who might have carried out the abduction. "We are trying our best to find the brothers."

There was no complaint, case or general diary against the two brothers, he said.

Cameron also said he wants Jihadi John to "face justice" for his crimes rather than be killed after it was reported that the ISIS militant, who is British, was wounded in a US-led air strikes carried out last Saturday. It is believed he was taken to hospital after the attack in Western Iraq.

Asked at the end of the G20 Leaders Summit in Brisbane whether he hoped Jihadi John, he said: "I want Jihadi John to face justice for the appalling acts carried out in Syria."

The White House said the US intelligence community was working to determine the authenticity of the video. National Security Council spokeswoman Bernadette Meehan said that if the video was authentic, the White House would be "appalled by the brutal murder of an innocent American". She said the White House expressed its deepest condolences to Kassig's family and friends.

Kassig's parents released a statement asking for their son to be "remembered for his important work" and said they were waiting for the authenticity of the video to be confirmed.

At the end of the 15-minute, 53second video released by Al Furqan media yesterday morning, a man who looks and sounds like the British terrorist stands over what appears to be the severed head of Peter Kassig.

The militant appears to be uninjured and is dressed in the same clothes as in previous videos -- a full black robe, a leather knife belt and a balaclava-style mask over his face showing only his eyes.

Speaking to the camera, he says: "This is Peter Edward Kassig, a US citizen of your country. Peter, who fought against the Muslims in Iraq whilst serving as a soldier in the American army, doesn't have much to say. His previous cellmates have already spoken on his behalf.

"But we say to you, Obama ... you claim to have withdrawn from Iraq four years ago. We said to you then that you were liars, that you had not withdrawn. And that if you had withdrawn you would return even after some time - you would return."

He adds: "Your forces will return greater in number than they were before.

We also remind you of the haunting

words of our Sheikh Abu Musab al-

Zarqawi told you. The spark has been lit here in Iraq and its heat will continue to intensify by Allah's permission until it burns the crusader army."

He said ISIS would "bury" American soldiers under Syrian soil.

In one of the most gruesome and horrifying scenes to be officially published by ISIS media outlets, the British terrorist is also seen leading ISIS fighters in a mass beheading of men claimed to be combatants loyal to Syrian president Bashar al-Assad.

Dressed in desert camouflage, ISIS soldiers are shown collecting hunting knives from a box and leading out their prisoners, whose hands are bound with plastic ties. All are dressed in black trousers and shirts.

While over a dozen ISIS jihadis, who appear to be from a mix of heritages, stand over the unarmed prisoners, the man who appears to be Jihadi John makes an address to the US president, as in previous videos. "To Obama, the dog of Rome, today

we are slaughtering the soldiers of Bashar and tomorrow we'll be slaughtering your soldiers. With Allah's permission we will break this final and last crusade and the Islamic State will soon like your puppet David Cameron said will begin to slaughter your people on your streets." The men are then beheaded, the film-

makers employing slow motion, multiple camera angles and sound effects to achieve maximum horror.

Entitled "Although the disbelievers like it", the film also gives a three-minute potted history of Islamic State since the invasion of Iraq by western allies in 2003 and celebrates recent pledges of allegiance from jihadi fighters from Libya, the Sinai, Algeria and Yemen, claiming

down that will hasten the end of days. The Daily Mail wrote that it has received an independent account of how Jihadi John was injured and rushed to hospital after a devastating air strike in Al Qaim, in Anbar Province, Western Iraq.

Jihadi John, the Briton who beheaded two British and two American hostages held by Islamic State terrorists, has been injured in a US-led air strike, according to reports received by the Foreign Office.

The masked "executioner" with a London accent is believed to have narrowly escaped death when he attended a summit of the group's leaders in an Iraqi town close to the Syrian border last Saturday.

The meeting was targeted by American and Iraqi jets. The joint mission left at least ten ISIS commanders dead, and around 40 injured.

The secret, heavily guarded meeting took place last Saturday in a makeshift underground bunker beneath a house in Al Qaim. At least 30 tribal elders from various parts of Syria and Iraq gathered to pledge allegiance to Al-Baghdadi, according to a well-placed Syrian source. He said Jihadi John, as a senior ISIS figure in his own right, who goes by the nomme de guerre Jalman Al-Britani, was also present.

A nurse who treated the wounded in a hospital in Deir-ez-Zour, confirmed that one of the names on the injured list was Jalman, saying it was 'the one who slaughtered the journalists'.

It is not clear how seriously the British fanatic was hurt, but the source said that both he and Al-Baghdadi were rushed to the Al Qaim General Hospital for treat-

ISIS members issued urgent calls through the local mosque's loudspeakers, appealing for the town's residents to donate blood at the hospital.

One source added that Jihadi John, Al-Baghdadi and the other wounded ISIS personnel were then driven to Syria, and travelling 200 miles north along the Euphrates valley to the ISIS stronghold of Raqqa.


