Unconvincing victory for Abahani

Four-time professional league champions Abahani began their King's Cup campaign with an unconvincing 1-0 against Indian regional side Assam Electricity Board at the Changlimithang Stadium in Thimphu yesterday. Guinean marksman Ismael Bangoura struck the deci-

sive goal in the 19th minute of the match to give a winning start to the Sky Blues, who are making their second appearance in this tournament with a short preparation after assembling almost an entirely new squad for the upcoming season.

Amalesh Sen's charges lined up in 4-3-3 formation with Bangoura partnered upfront by Wahed Ahmed and Aminur Rahman Sabij and the three-pronged attack posed constant threat in the opposition defence right from the word go. The Sky Blues took a deserved lead when former BJMC

striker Bangoura latched on to a cross from Sajib and bundled the ball home past the Assam Electricity goal-However, the Guinean was wasteful ever since as he

blasted a spot kick wide off target and headed wide from inside the 12 yards. National striker Wahed also failed to beat the Assam goalkeeper in a one-on-one situation a few minutes before the break.

The Sky Blues had to endure some nervous moments after their veteran midfielder Prantosh Kumar Das was sent off in the 72nd minute, but the ten-man Abahani managed to keep the Assamese outfit at bay to eke out a single-goal win.

Amalesh was happy to start the tournament on a winning note but believed the margin should have been bigger.

"I am happy with the victory. The boys played the match according to my plan and created a lot of scoring chances even if they availed only one," said Abahani's long-serving

War on beards!

The chairman of Turkish football club Genclerbirligi has vowed to fine any of his players who have beards after claiming some looked like students of an Islamic school.

"I'm 80 and I shave every day," said Ilhan Cavcav.

"Is this an imam school? You are a sportsman. You should be a model for the youth," he said in an interview with the Dogan news agency.

Genclerbirligi will fine any player who takes to the pitch with a beard 25,000 Turkish lira (around 9,000 euros).

Cavcav said he had appealed to Yildirim Demiroren, the Turkish Football Federation chairman, to bring in a nationwide ban on footballers having beards.



South Africa struck back with a vengeance in the second one-day international against Australia at the WACA Ground in Perth on Sunday, levelling the series with a three-wicket win.

Proteas skipper AB de Villiers had vowed his side would be seeking redemption after being beaten by 32 runs in the series opener on Friday. His team backed those words with a superb bowling

display as the home side were dismissed for just 154 in 41.4 overs on what appeared a good batting wicket. South Africa overcame some anxious moments and

reckless batting to edge to the victory target, reaching 157 for seven in just 27.4 overs. Paceman Josh Hazlewood was one bright light for the

Australians, with career-best figures of 5-31. Towering paceman Morne Morkel led the way for South

Africa with 5-21, his second five-wicket haul in one-day internationals and career-best figures in a man-of-thematch performance. The South Africans made an impact with the ball from

the outset, destroying the Australian top order to have the home side in deep trouble at 34-4. It was Morkel who struck the first blow with David

Comeback Roger way

Roger Federer will face Novak Djokovic in the final of the ATP Tour Finals after the world's top two both survived dramatic semifinals at London's O2 Arena

on Saturday.

Federer the world number two, saved four match points before defeating Stan Wawrinka, 4-6, 7-5, 7-6 (8/6), while world number one Djokovic emerged from his first serious test of the tournament with a 6-1, 3-6, 6-0 victory over Japan's Kei Nishikori. Federer looked down and out when

Wawrinka served for the match in the final set, but the six-time champion responded superbly and eventually booked his ninth appearance in the final of the season-ending

Djokovic had swept through the group stage in imperious style, but he was pushed harder by Nishikori, who became the first player to take a set off him since October, before a strong finish secured the Serb's fourth appearance in the final. Djokovic, who has lifted the Tour Finals

trophy three times, remains on course to become the first man to win the event three years in a row since Ivan Lendl in the 1980s. The 27-year-old has now won 31 succes-

sive indoor matches, including 14 at the Tour Finals. "Kei was playing great and this has been the best season of his life but he made some crucial

double faults in the third set," Djokovic said. Federer held his nerve impressively despite an erratic performance in the best match of a tournament sorely lacking memorable encounters this year.

The 33-year-old has now saved 11 match points in three winning causes this year, with the others against Gael Monfils at the US Open and Leonardo Mayer at the Shanghai Masters.

The 124th final of Federer's illustrious career is a rematch of this year's Wimbledon final, which Djokovic won in five sets.
