Banks adopt global practice to avert fraud

Banks are going for a centralised banking system that has proved to be an effective method globally to reduce costs and credit and operational risks.

Already four private banks -- Brac, Eastern, The City and the newly established NRB Bank -- have introduced the system. Of the foreign banks, HSBC, Standard Chartered and Citi have been following the system for a long time now.

Frauds and forgeries get reduced

in the centralised banking system because of strong monitoring and supervision, said Ali Reza Iftekhar, managing director of Eastern Bank.

Under the centralised system, a bank manages its business and operations from the head office through a strong technological backbone.

The traditional branch becomes just a mere sales and services point; it is forbidden from disbursing any loan. Even a branch manager cannot open an account without sending it to the central processing system. **READ MORE ON B3**

US trade show kicks off today

The 23rd US Trade Show begins in Dhaka today to showcase American products in Bangladesh, as both the countries are important trade part-

Commerce Minister Tofail Ahmed is scheduled to open the three-day exhibition as the chief guest, Aftab ul Islam, president of American Chamber of Commerce (AmCham) in Bangladesh, said at a press meet at Sonargaon Hotel in the capital yesterday.

Ruposhi Bangla hotel had been the venue of the show since 1992, but it is being held at Sonargaon hotel for the first time this year, as renovation work is going on at Ruposhi, he said.

Forty-three US firms will showcase their products occupying 78

43 US exhibitors will showcase products at 78 booths

Major companies include Boeing, PepsiCo, Coca-Cola, Ford Motor, Caterpillar, Dell, IBM, Microsoft and MasterCard.

Bilateral trade between the US and Bangladesh was \$6.5b in 2013

In 2013, Bangladesh imported goods worth \$712m from the US and exported products worth \$5.4b

booths at the fair to be jointly organised by AmCham and the American embassy in Bangladesh, he said.

Many Fortune 500 listed firms, including Boeing, Coca-Cola Company, Ford Motor Company,

Caterpillar, Dell, IBM, Harvard University, Microsoft, PepsiCo International and MasterCard, will take part in the event, he said.

The entry fee of the fair has been fixed at Tk 20 a person, but students with uniform and identity cards will enjoy free access, Islam said.

On the relation between the two countries now, Islam said it is better than ever.

"Misunderstandings in some issues have been created only because of communication gap in political, diplomatic and economic issues."

The relationship between the two countries has started improving in recent years, and both the countries inked the Trade and Investment Cooperation Forum Agreement in Washington in 2013, he said.

Commodity importers to get single-level tax system: minister

The government plans to introduce a system for basic commodity importers under which they will be allowed to pay taxes at only one level of the supply chain, Commerce Minister Tofail Ahmed said yesterday.

Currently, such importers pay taxes at the import, production and sales levels, which increase the goods' prices in local markets although they are imported at low prices.


The minister, however, did not mention any specific level for the taxes.

Ahmed spoke in a meeting with the importers of edible oil, sugar, flour and wheat at his secretariat in Dhaka, when the minister was informed about the current stock and import situation of the products in the local market. The minister urged the

businessmen to set fair prices for edible oil to keep pace with the current price of the item in international markets. Ahmed said the stock of

basic commodities is adequate now and there is no chance of a crisis in supply.

"We want cooperation from the businessmen so that the prices of essentials remain stable."

Ruposhi Bangla renovations fail to start on time

The much-awaited renovation work at Ruposhi Bangla has been delayed due to the failure to award contracts for the massive reconstruction on time. The renovations, which are part of a 30-year

management deal signed in February 2012 between Ruposhi Bangla's owner -- the state-run Bangladesh Services Ltd -- and InterContinental Hotels Group, were scheduled to take off on November 1. The hotel has already been shut down on September 1 in preparation.

But due to a wide gap between the price quoted by the lowest bidder and the estimated costs, the authorities failed to wrap up the tendering process on time.

The difference is around \$3 million, and as the issue is not settled yet, the contract cannot be awarded, said an official asking not to be named.

SUBMIT YOUR e-TIN NUMBER TO THE BANK

As per newly amended Income Tax Ordinance, 1984 through Finance Act 2014, if the customers do not submit 12 digit e-TIN, the banks will have to deduct/withhold 15% income tax instead of 10% at source from interest/profit earnings on the deposit accounts.

In view of above please collect and fill up the e-TIN confirmation form from the branch of your bank and submit it with any of the following documents:

- Copy of the e-TIN certificate, or
- Copy of the Tax clearance certificate having 12 digit e-TIN, or
- Copy of acknowledgement receipt of Tax Return issued by the Tax Authority with 12 digit e-TIN.

If you are a user of the bank's Credit Card but do not maintain a deposit account with the bank, you will still need to submit your e-TIN for the record of your Credit Card.

Novo Nordisk to build new research labs in Denmark

Novo Nordisk, the world's largest insulin maker, will invest about \$130 million to build new laboratories at the company's research and development campus in Måløv, Denmark.

Construction of the new laboratory facility, Diabetes Research House, has already started. It is expected to be ready by early 2016 and will be able to accommodate around 350 employees.

The initiative will also create indirect jobs for another 1,000 people, according to a statement.

"The new lab facility will provide an environment for cutting-edge diabetes research within biotechnology and protein chemistry," said Mads Krogsgaard Thomsen, executive vice-president and chief science officer of Novo Nordisk.

Novo Nordisk is a global healthcare company with 90 years of innovation and leadership in diabetes care. It commands roughly half the world's market for insulin and a quarter of overall diabetes-care medicine.

It manufactures some of its insulin products in Eskayef, one of the fastest growing pharmaceutical companies in Bangladesh. The products are distributed by Transcom Distribution, which maintains the global practices of the Danish company.

Novo Nordisk commands over 70 percent of the market for insulin in Bangladesh.

It has been working in close collaboration with Diabetic Association of Bangladesh (DAB) to change the face of diabetes for over 50 years now, supporting it to raise awareness and run health education programmes.


