### Wage tougher Homeless people anti-govt denied nat'l ID cards movement Urges BNP

Say speakers, citing it as an obstacle to ensuring their civic rights

The street dwellers are deprived of civic rights since they are not issued birth certificates and national identity (NID) cards due to a lack of home addresses, speakers said at a discussion yesterday.

The officials concerned refuse to provide the documents if holding numbers or utility bills are not submitted, they told the programme titled "Obstacle to the civic rights of street dwellers".

National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and Coalition for the Urban Poor, a forum of national and international NGOs working for alleviation of urban poverty, jointly organised it in the capital's Cirdap auditorium.

AKM Saiful Islam Choudhury, project director of Birth and Death

Registration Project, said there was no bar to issuing birth certificates to the homeless people. If anyone asks for holding numbers, it is a manifestation of narrow-mindedness, he added. However, the copy of a utility bill

or house rent receipt or holding tax receipt is needed to have an NID card, according to the NID wing under at the Election Commission. The speakers urged removal of

such barriers to ensure the basic rights of the homeless people. Speaking on the issue, NHRC

Chairman Prof Mizanur Rahman said, "The state has failed to ensure rights of all people." He said he would write to the Election Commission soon seeking

a remedy to this problem of the homeless people. Putting the figure of the street

Yesterday, the Appellate Division also started hearing two other appeals filed by the BNP chief regarding Zia Orphanage and Charitable corruption cases filed by the ACC in 2008 and 2011. The court will resume the hearing today.

## Man dies falling from roof

A man died after falling from the rooftop of a mosque while asleep in the capital's Jatrabari early yesterday.

Hossain Ali, 28, of Mymensingh, a day labourer, had been sleeping on the roof of the three-storey Madina Mosque in north Jatrabari over the last one year. Locals rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital around 3:00am where he died after two hours, said hospital sources.

Democracy International (DI) formally launched the "Narir Joye Sobar Joy" (When women win, we all win) campaign at a hotel in the capital, with an aim to advance women's political leadership in Bangladesh.

The speakers also said women should be provided equal opportunity at every sphere of life because sustainable development was impossible without their empowerment.

US Ambassador in Dhaka Dan W Mozena said women's participation in politics must be increased for strengthening democracy in Bangladesh. The four-year campaign, which began unofficially in March 2012, is funded by USAID and UKaid.

Bangladesh Mohila Parishad President Ayesha Khanom said cross-party unity on women's rights issue was very critical for political empowerment of women.

## Insensitive portrayal trauma for peers

Selina Hossain tells workshop

When presented in an insensitive manner, news reports on child abuse end up traumatising hundreds of other children, said noted author Selina Hossain yesterday.

Showing visual images and revealing identities of child victims may not deter child abusers but will mentally torture child viewers for a long time, she opined.

She was addressing a workshop on ethical reporting on child issues organised by Mass-line Media Centre (MMC) and Save the Children at The Daily Star Centre in the capital.

The noted author also criticised FM radio station jockeys for using English words unnecessarily in an otherwise Bangla sentence.

"They should speak English altogether and stop using the mangled Bangla," she said.
