Ronaldo on the double

Cristiano Ronaldo struck twice to take his goal tally for the season to a jaw-dropping 20 in 11 La Liga appearances as leaders Real Madrid subdued plucky top-flight debutants Eibar 4-0 on Saturday.

James Rodriguez nodded the visitors in front in the 23rd minute at the tiny Ipurua stadium in the Basque Country, which holds fewer than 6,000 spectators, before Ronaldo's scuffed shot made it 2-0 two minutes before the break.

Karim Benzema cracked in the third in the 69th minute and Ronaldo made it 4-0 from the penalty spot seven minutes from time as the European champions swept to a 14th victory in a row in all competitions.

Mid-table Eibar, whose entire squad is worth roughly as much as Ronaldo's annual wages of 20 million euros

(\$24.8 million), created several scoring chances but were outclassed by Real's galaxy of superstars.

Their latest success put the world's richest club by income four points

Lionel Messi matched a 59-year-old record with his 251st La Liga goal to equal Telmo Zarra's mark as the leading goalscorer in the history of the Spanish top flight.

The Argentine curled home a trademark free-kick to reach the mark in just his 289th La Liga appearance and give Barcelona the lead against Sevilla.

clear at the top with 30 points from 12 matches during which they have amassed 46 goals.

Atletico Madrid had earlier closed to within a point of their crosstown rivals when midfielder Tiago scored one goal and created another for Diego

Godin in a 3-1 win for the champions at home to Malaga.

Tiago nodded Koke's corner powerfully into the net in the 13th minute at the Calderon and the lively Antoine Griezmann tapped home an Arda Turan centre three minutes before halftime.

Roque Santa Cruz set nerves jangling when he pulled a goal back for sixth-placed Malaga just after the hour but their chances were extinguished when forward Samuel picked up a second yellow card in the 73rd minute.

Atletico made sure of the points when Tiago hooked the ball to the back post for an unmarked Godin to head home six minutes from time before captain Gabi picked up his second caution in the 88th.

The champions, who won their first top-flight title in 18 years last season, are second on 26 points, one ahead of Barcelona who host fifth-placed Sevilla later on Saturday.

BUNDESLIGA

Bayern crush Hoffenheim

Undefeated champions Bayern Munich continued their seemingly unstoppable charge towards the Bundesliga title, crushing Hoffenheim 4-0 on Saturday to extend their lead at the top.

With second-placed VfL Wolfsburg losing 3-2 at Schalke 04, Bayern go seven points clear, having yet to lose in any of the three competitions they are in this season.

Mario Goetze drilled in with Bayern's first shot on goal in the 23rd minute to go joint top of the scorers' list with seven and Robert Lewandowski headed in his sixth of the campaign from a cross by Arjen Robben.

The Dutchman then added a third for Bayern, who welcomed back Bastian Schweinsteiger as a second-half substitute for his first appearance since the World Cup final having recovered from a knee injury.

Substitute Sebastian Rode completed the rout to lift Bayern to 30 points.

Hoffenheim finished with 10 men following the late dismissal of Adam Szalai.

"We had problems at the start but then we then hit our stride," said coach Pep Guardiola, whose team travel to Manchester City for the Champions League next week.

MU edge Arsenal, Chelsea pull away

A Kieran Gibbs own goal and a Wayne Rooney strike saw Manchester United return to the Premier League's top four with a bruising 2-1 victory at Arsenal on Saturday.

Arsenal subjected United's makeshift back-four to heavy pressure throughout the game at the Emirates Stadium, but Gibbs's unwitting intervention gave the visitors a 56th-minute lead before Rooney added a late second.

Arsenal substitute Olivier Giroud marked his comeback from a broken leg by slamming home in the 95th minute, but United held on to leave their rivals 15 points adrift of leaders Chelsea in eighth place.

To compound matters, Arsene Wenger's side lost key midfielder Jack Wilshere and goalkeeper Wojciech Szczesny to injury, four days before an important Champions League home game with Borussia Dortmund.

An injury blight obliged United coach Louis van Gaal to deploy a three-man defence of Chris Smalling, Paddy McNair and Tyler Blackett, and the visitors then saw left-back Luke Shaw limp off after turning his ankle.

Arsenal peppered the visitors' goal with shots, but United goalkeeper David de Gea kept them at bay, notably thwarting Wilshere and Danny Welbeck, who was making his first appearance against the club he left in September.

Wilshere was forced off in the 55th minute after turning his right ankle in a challenge with McNair, and United struck barely a minute later.

Szczesny collided with Gibbs as he came for Ashley Young's left-wing cross and when

Antonio Valencia drilled the ball back into the box, the prone Gibbs instinctively stuck out a leg, only to send the ball into his own net.

Szczesny had to go off, with Emiliano Martinez coming on, and the Argentine was a virtual spectator until Angel di Maria freed Rooney to run through and chip home in the 85th minute.

Giroud fired into the top-left corner from 20 yards mid-way through eight minutes of stoppage time, but United survived to give Van Gaal the first away win of his tenure.

Earlier, Diego Costa scored again as Chelsea established a seven-point lead at the summit by comfortably beating 10-man West Bromwich Albion 2-0 at Stamford Bridge.

Costa scored his 11th goal of the season in the 11th minute, chesting down Oscar's cross and volleying home, with Eden Hazard adding a second before Claudio Jacob was sent off for a two-footed challenge on Costa.

Victory saw Chelsea set a new club record of 12 unbeaten games from the start of the season.

Mourinho's side are now seven points clear of second-place Southampton, who visit Aston Villa on Monday, and remain eight points above defending champions Manchester City, who won 2-1 at home to Swansea City.

Rosberg edges Hamilton

Nico Rosberg survived intense pressure and several nervous errors on Saturday to claim what may be a vital pole position for the title-deciding Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, edging out his Mercedes teammate and arch-rival Lewis Hamilton.

Rosberg, who secured his 11th pole of the season, has to come first and hope that Hamilton, who leads him by 17 points in the drivers' championship, finishes outside the top two to overtake the Briton and take the Formula One drivers' title.

Rosberg clocked a best time of one minute and 40.480 in the top ten shootout to finish ahead of Hamilton with impressive Finn Valtteri Bottas third for Williams.

BFF plans for Feb concert

The Bangladesh Football Federation is all set to host a concert at the Bangabandhu National Stadium in mid February in order to raise funds for youth football development after it received green signal from sports regulatory body National Sports Council (NSC).

The BFF, which is planning to organise the concert jointly with an event management company named 'Zero Degree', is looking forward to host artistes from neighbouring countries as well as from Bangladesh and expect to raise significant amount of money from the event.

"We have received the authorisation from the NSC and we will sign a deal with the event management company, Zero Degree, soon. We hope the concert, which we will likely host on February 13, will generate significant amount of fund which will be used for youth development, especially for the BFF Academy in Sylhet," informed BFF's senior vice-president Abdus Salam Murshedy yesterday.

It may be mentioned here that BFF had previously opposed to hosting concerts at the premier football venue of the country, as these concerts often cause much damage to the pitch. Murshedy, however, said they will take every precaution to make sure the pitch is not damaged by the concert this time.

Klopp reveals EPL interest

Borussia Dortmund boss Jurgen Klopp has revealed he is keen on managing in the Premier League if he ever leaves Germany.

Klopp has long been linked with a move to England, with Manchester City, Chelsea and Arsenal all said to have been keen on the German at various times.

The 47-year-old is one of the most highly-regarded coaches in Europe and, with Dortmund struggling in the Bundesliga this season, his revelation that he is a big fan of English football is likely to lead to further speculation about his future.

"It's the only country, I think, where I should work, really, next to Germany, because it's the only country I know the language a little bit and I need the language for my work."

Zidane wins appeal

A Spanish sports court on Friday backed Zinedine Zidane's appeal against a three month ban from coaching Real Madrid's reserve team over his disputed qualifications.

Spain's football federation imposed the ban at the end of October, arguing the former France midfielder did not have the right licence to coach in Spain.

Real appealed and the three-time World Footballer of the Year was allowed to continue coaching while the Court of Arbitration for Sport considered the case.

Zidane's assistant Santiago Sanchez, who was also sanctioned by the Spanish federation, the RFEF was also cleared to continue his duties while the case was considered.

Real Madrid initially went to the



RFEF appeal committee but when that was rejected, the 10-time European champions turned to the Court of Arbitration.

"The appeal was accepted. This annuls the resolution from the appeals committee of the RFEF," a spokesman for the court of Arbitration for Sport told AFP.

Real insisted that Zidane has the proper qualifications to coach their reserve team, although he needs a UEFA 'A' licence level three badge to do


so and he only holds a level two.

Spanish coaching school Cenafe complained to the Spanish federation, alleging that Real were using Sanchez's name on teamsheets as coach to get around regulations preventing Zidane from running the reserve team, Real Madrid Castilla.

But Real said Zidane "has been authorised by the French Football Federation to work as a head coach" for Real Madrid Castilla and its league.


Although Zidane has not completed the full quota of practice hours with the French Football Federation (FFF) to gain promotion to level three, the FFF supported Real's case, arguing UEFA regulations allow a coach who is being trained to work.

Real Madrid welcomed the court of Arbitration for Sport's ruling, saying in a statement it would allow Zidane and Sanchez "to carry out their professional activities."
