### Body of missing girl found in flat

#### Mahjabin committed suicide

Says autopsy report; her father rejects it

Shamarukh Mahjabin, who was found dead in her inlaw's house in the capital's Dhanmondi, committed suicide, said the autopsy report of Dhaka Medical College, which was received by police yesterday.

However, Nurul Islam, father of Mahjabin, rejected the report saying, "I said it earlier that the autopsy report would not be fair."

He filed a murder case accusing his son-in-law Humayun Sultan, Humayun's father Khan Tipu Sultan, former lawmaker from Jessore-5; and his mother Dr Jasmine Ara.

Assistant Prof Sohel Mahmud of the forensic department of DMC told journalists, "We got the reports of all the samples, collected for the autopsy, and reached to a conclusion that it was a case of suicide.'

Mahjabin, 26, was found dead on November 13 Later, her husband Humayun was arrested and sent to jail. Humayun and his parents claim that she SEE PAGE 4 COL 4 | committed suicide.

Meanwhile, the apex court also fixed today for resuming hearing on another appeal of Khaleda in Zia Charitable Trust graft case challenging an HC verdict that had upheld the charge framing against her by a lower court.

The Anti-Corruption Commission in 2009 filed the Zia Orphanage Trust graft case on charge of embezzling over Tk 2.1 crore by forming a "fake" trust which only exists on papers and filed the other case in 2011 on the charge of abusing power during setting up the charitable trust.
