### Four to die for killing schoolboy

A court here yesterday sentenced four people to death for killing a six-year-old schoolboy after abduction in 2013.

The convicts are Saidul Islam, Md Al-Amin, Rafiqul Islam and Abdur Rashid of Chalklangura village in Durgapur upazila of the district.

According to the case statement, on August 19 in 2013, the convicted four abducted Emon Ahmed, son of Badal Ahmed of the village.

They later killed the boy after failing to realise ransom money from his mother.

Nurunnahar, mother of the deceased, filed a case accusing six people, including the convicted four with Durgapur Police Station the same night.

After examining the records and witnesses, Netrakona Women and Child Repression Prevention Tribunal Judge Dr AKM Abul Kashem handed down the verdict in presence of three of the convicts while Abdur Rashid was tried in absentia.

## Kuakata fishermen fell reserve forest trees

All to make space for fish drying

A section of local fishermen cut down over 100 trees at Gongamoti reserve forest in Kuakata to make space for drying fish.

Locals said dried fish wholesaler Anwar Hossain managed the fishermen to do this illegal act to set up a shutki palli, an area for drying fish, in the reserve forest area, around 5-km away from Kuakata zero point.

With the beginning of dry season, fishermen engage themselves in drying fish in the area. They do the job from November to March as they net a huge quantity of saltwater fishes during the period.

Every year, over 100 fishermen dry fishes in Khajura area on the sea beach, locally called as shutki palli. But this year, Anwar Hossain set up another shutki palli in the reserve forest area, by felling over 100 trees. At least 25 makeshift houses have also been made in the area.

Abdul Hanif Hawlader of Gongamati area said the

fishermen build houses and wooden platforms to keep fishes to dry, using the felled trees. They also use woods as fuel, he added.

Locals said Anwar advanced the fishermen some money to dry fish and sell them to him. He has a store on the Kuskata sea beach.

Contacted, wholesaler Anwar said he has built a house in the area for his relatives. "I don't know

how other people have built their houses in the area," he said, adding that he didn't invest money to set up shutki palli in the reserve forest area.

Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Mihir Kanti told this correspondent that he was not aware of the matter. "We will investigate the matter and take necessary steps against the persons involved in cutting down the trees.

### 'Robber' killed in mob beating

A suspected robber was killed and three others injured in mob beating at Shuktail village in Gopalganj Sadar upazila early yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Rahim Sadar, 35, son of Russel Sardar of Puraton Bazar area of the upazila, reports our correspondent.

Police said, a group of 12-13 robbers swooped on the house of Zafar Master around 2:00 am at the village.

Hearing the hue and cry, villagers rushed to the scene and caught four gang members from the spot.

The villagers then gave the four a good beating, leaving one of them dead and three others seriously injured.

Four villagers were also injured as the robbers hurled a cocktail at them while trying to flee the area.

In Joypurhat, four members of a family sustained injuries as a gang of robbers stabbed and beat them up during a robbery at Borgachha village in Akkelpur upazila early Monday.

Of the injured, Abu Raihan, 27, was rushed to Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital in Bogra, while his wife Morzina Akhtar, 22, Rony Wahed, 26, and Asma Khatun, 19, were admitted to Akkelpur Upazila Health Complex, reports our Dinajpur correspondent.

Witnesses, said a gang of 12/15 robbers stormed into the house of Wahed Ali around 1:30am and took the house members hostage at gunpoint and looted money and gold ornaments weighing around 10 tolas.

The gang also stabbed Raihan and beat up three others of the family when they tried to resist them.

Police yesterday arrested two people in the upazila in connection with the robbery.

## Two incidents in Patuakhali Schoolgirl abducted a month ago yet to be rescued

Domestic help remains untraced

Over a month into her abduction, Kalapara police are yet to rescue a 15-year-old schoolgirl.

A resident of the upazila town, the victim is a Class X student of a local girls' school, said police.

On October 17, a gang, allegedly led by Zakaria, came on five motorbikes and kidnapped the girl while she was returning home from the house tutor's residence in the town, said the victim's mother.

The following day, a case was filed with Kalapara police station, accusing five people including Zakaria.

The sister and mother of Zakaria are now threatening us of dire consequences if we did not withdraw the case, the mother of the girl told this corre-

spondent.

Contacted, OC of the PS said that the accused went into hiding after the incident and police were raiding different areas to arrest them.

Meanwhile, a 15-year-old domestic help, who went missing about 10 months, ago still remained untraced.

The victim hails from Dakkhin Dharandee village under Sadar upazila. She worked as a domestic help at a residence in Rajbari district town, said family sources.

"One Moniruzzaman of the same village, who was working at a local NGO in Rajbari town, took my daughter to his home in the town on January 24, assuring of paying her Tk 1,500 as monthly salary," said the father of the vic-

tim.

The employer and his wife Baby Begum also gave me Tk 5,000 in advance at that time, he said, adding that Moniruzzaman told me that they sent our daughter to the village for celebrating the Eid-ul-Fitr but she did not return to her workplace.

I recently learnt that Moniruzzaman left Rajbari for Dhaka but my daughter still remained untraced, said the father of the girl.

On September 21, a case was filed under Woman and Child Repression Prevention Act in this connection.

S M Ziaul Haque, OC of Sadar police station, said punitive action would be taken against the offender after investigating the matter.

## Gangsters of Bollywood

A key aim of the threats to top stars is boosting the gangsters' credibility when trying to extort cash from less well-known -- but often wealthier -- targets.

In recent years local criminals have largely abandoned the nation's high-profile, high-octane film industry for less risky ventures in sectors such as real estate and finance.

But last month Mahesh Bhatt, a well known director, escaped a third attempt on his life by gunmen in the city hired by a gang leader living overseas.

Bhatt told the Times of India newspaper that "the film fraternity must stand shoulder to shoulder with Mumbai police and fight the menace of organised crime".

"If we try and buy peace by giving in to their demands, we would be giving a blood transfusion to this monster which is taking its last gasp," the director said.

Top Bollywood stars such as Shah Rukh Khan and Salman Khan, idolised by tens of millions in south Asia and beyond, are among those who have been threatened in recent months.

"The threats serve a purpose. The target is not the celebrity as such. The aim is to make other people think that if the extortionist is prepared to go after such high-profile people then they had better pay up and keep quiet," a senior police officer dealing with crime in Mumbai said.

Investigators have intercepted communications indicating that gunmen have been told not to hurt top film stars but simply to scare them.

"When there was a serious attempt on one star's life, we were listening to the instructions to the gunmen and

heard him being told: "This time, shoot this one properly," the senior officer said.

Targets appear to have also been chosen to generate maximum attention. Anything involving top stars will be widely reported across India's raucous media, while Bhatt, the director, is known for speaking out on a range of issues, and particularly links between the film industry and criminals.

For many years Bollywood, which produces more than 350 films each year, generating an estimated \$50bn-plus revenue, has been almost synonymous with the notorious gangs of Mumbai, a city of more than 20 million people.

The relationship has long been a tempestuous one. Black money flowed into often high-risk productions which would otherwise have not received funding while some actors and gang members became close.

Wanted criminals were regular guests at big Bollywood weddings and other functions.

"In the 1990s they were everywhere -- funding, planting their people inside, even deciding casting," said Hussain Zaidi, one of India's best-known crime reporters and an expert on the Mumbai underworld.

At the end of the decade, a series of directors and producers were attacked and several killed, while many more secretly paid large sums or handed over lucrative rights to criminals.

Now big corporations are more likely to back major productions than underworld dons. New legal structures, based on practices elsewhere in the world, also protect actors and directors from extortionists.
