# Sirajul killed sixty

Most of them were Hindus, says 1st prosecution witness

A freedom fighter yesterday told the International Crimes Tribunal-1 that war crimes accused Sheikh Sirajul Haque stabbed to death one Gobina Das of Ranjitpur in Bagerhat during the Liberation War.

"He also stabbed and injured one Soilen Das," said Dilip Das, the first prosecution witness in the war crimes case.

In his testimony, the witness said on May 13, 1971 Sirajul along with other Razakars attacked Ranjitpur, a Hindu-majority village, situated some 18 kilometres away from Bagerhat town, and killed around 60 people, mostly Hindus.

Dilip said after the incident, the war crimes accused became known as "Siraj Kosai [butcher]".

The freedom fighter said he along with others took shelter in a nearby bush and returned to the village after the Razakars left. "We buried the bodies," he said.

Dilip said supporters and activists of Muslim League formed Razakar, auxiliary force to Pakistani occupation army, after the proclamation of independence

on March 26, 1971. Sirajul became deputy commander of the Razakar force.

The proceedings of the case were adjourned until December 4.

Meanwhile, ICT-2 yesterday took into cognisance the eight war crimes charges brought against Forkan Mallik of Patuakhali for his alleged involvement in war crimes.

On November 17, the prosecution pressed the charges, including mass killing, murder, rape, arson and forced religious conversion, allegedly committed by Forkan during the Liberation War.

In presence of 63-year-old Forkan of Chailabunia village in Mirzaganj upazila of Patuakhali, the three-member tribunal led by Justice Obaidul Hassan fixed December 9 for hearing the charges.

Earlier on June 25, the Detective Branch of police arrested Forkan at Rupatali Bus Stand in Barisal. He was later shown arrested in the war crimes case. An investigation agency of the tribunals completed investigation into the allegations against him on October 27.

## Sayedee again gets check-up at BSMMU

Convicted war criminal Delawar Hossain Sayedee was again taken to Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University for medical check-up yesterday after he had complained of lower back and knee pain.

He was sent there from Dhaka Central Jail, Sayedee's family, BSMMU and the prison authorities said.

The 74-year-old Jamaat leader was later sent back to the jail after his x-ray at the hospital, Senior Jail Super Farman Ali told The Daily Star.

Sayedee's son Masood Sayedee said the x-ray reports were yet to be delivered.

On Monday, Sayedee was shifted to the Dhaka jail from Gazipur's Kashimpur jail following a medical check-up at the BSMMU as he complained of chest pain.

"The project will emphasise engineering faults at the black spots," he told The Daily Star. According to the ARI, there are 209 black spots in all across the country.

The Daily Star reports show at least 8,270 lives were lost in road accidents between January 2010 and June 2014 in the country, meaning at least five died every day. According to police records, on average 3,000 people die each year in road accidents in Bangladesh. The World Bank and the World Health Organization, however, put the figure at 12,000 and 18,000 respectively, says a 2011 report of the ARI.

"The government says it has recruited 40,000 people to the police force. Then where are all these police personnel gone?" he said, alleging that the cops were busy carrying out the government's agenda and that they had no time to ensure public safety.

Earlier in the day, Fakhru told reporters after a BNP joint meeting at the Nayapaltn central office that Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal had no committee other than the one approved by party chief Khaleida Zia.

The response came when journalists asked him about the dissident JCD leaders, who would stage a sit-in in front of the Nayapaltn office today, demanding cancellation of the new central committee.

At the joint meeting, BNP finalised a series of programmes to mark Martyred Intellectuals Day on December 14, Victory Day on December 16, and the day for "fall of autocracy" on December 6.

### MURDER CASES AGAINST FAKHRUL

A Dhaka court yesterday asked detectives to submit probe reports before it by January 13 next year in two murder cases against Fakhru and 25 other leaders and activists of the BNP-led alliance.

Meanwhile, the court granted permanent bail to Gayeshwar Chandra Roy, Aman Ullah Aman and MA Salam following three separate bail petitions in the cases.

Advocate Sanaullah Miah represented Fakhru in his absence while time petitions were submitted for BNP leaders--Mahbubuddin Khokon, Mirza Abbas and Sadeque Hossain Khoka--as they could not appear before the court. The others, now on bail, were present in the court.

Of the cases, one was filed for killing a policeman in an arson attack at Bangla Motor in the capital on December 24 last year during the alliance's anti-government demonstration.

The other was filed by police on December 1 last year, a day after an unknown passer-by was killed during the same demonstration at Malibagh Chowdhurypara in the capital.
