

Child labour still there

Claims US Dept of Labour about Bangladesh's informal garment sector

A US agency in its new survey Monday claimed the presence of child labour in the Bangladesh's informal garment sector, as it expanded its list of products worldwide it says were likely produced by child or forced labour.

The US Department of Labour said 11 goods made with child labour have been added to the sixth edition of its list.

The goods are: garments from Bangladesh; cotton and sugarcane from India; vanilla from Madagascar; fish from Kenya; fish from Yemen; alcoholic beverages, meat, textiles, and timber from Cambodia; and palm oil from Malaysia. The full list now includes 136 goods from 74 countries.

"There's a story behind each item on these lists -- a child facing back-breaking labour without education or other opportunities for a better life or an adult trapped in a dismal job through deceit or threats," Labour Secretary Thomas E Perez said in a statement.

"These lists raise awareness about child and forced labour. Through collective efforts we can, and must, work together to end these cycles of exploitation."

Marcia Eugenia, head of the US Office of Child Labour, Forced Labour, and Human Trafficking, cited Bangladesh is of particular concern, according to the news agency AP.

French MPs vote for recognising Palestine

French lawmakers voted yesterday in favour of recognising Palestine as a state, sparking an immediate angry reaction from Israel which said such "unilateral measures" would harm efforts towards Middle East peace.

Following hot on the heels of similar votes in Britain and Spain, French MPs voted 339 to 151 in favour of a motion urging the government to recognise the state of Palestine as a way of achieving a "definitive resolution of the conflict.

The vote -- which is nonbinding on the government but highly symbolic -comes as European countries seek alternative ways to restart the stalled Middle East process.

36 fortune seekers rescued in Ctg

Thirty-six people were rescued from the Karnaphuli river in Chittagong by the coast guards while allegedly being trafficked to Malaysia last night.

Acting on a tip-off, a patrol team of the coast guards intercepted the small engine boat near Chittagong Boat Club area around 10:00pm and found 36 people huddled on the trawler, said Captain Shahidul Islam of the Coast Guard's east

Quoting the rescued, Captain Shahidul said the boat was carrying them to the Saint Martin's Island from where they would be put onto a larger boat to Malaysia.

Five boatmen were detained in the drive and hunts were on for apprehending other members of the trafficking gang, he added.



Bhutan PM due Saturday

Bhutanese Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay is due in Dhaka on December 6 on a three-day visit which is expected to strengthen cooperation in electricity, connectivity and trade between the two countries.

This is going to be Tshering's first visit to Bangladesh since he assumed office in July 2013.

The Bhutanese PM will lead a 10-member highprofile team of ministers and he will be accompanied by a business delegation during the visit.

The prime ministers of Bangladesh and Bhutan will have a bilateral meeting when the two sides will discuss a host of issues, including power generation, water resources management, trade, connectivity and culture.

ISIS leader's family detained in Lebanon

The Lebanese army have detained a wife and child of Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, the leader of Islamic State (ISIS), as they crossed from Syria, security officials said yesterday.

The officials declined to reveal the name or nationality of the woman, whom they described as one of his wives.

The Lebanese newspaper As-Safir reported that the army had detained the woman in coordination with "foreign intelligence apparatus".


The arrest is a blow to Baghdadi and could be used as a bargaining chip against his group.

HIV is evolving to become less deadly and less infectious, according to a major scientific study.

The team at the University of Oxford shows the virus is being "watered down" as it adapts to our immune systems. It said it was taking longer for HIV infection to

cause Aids and that the changes in the virus may help efforts to contain the pandemic. Some virologists suggest the virus may eventually
