### Pellegrini hails Aguero

Manchester City striker Sergio Aguero is one of the best five players in the world, his manager Manuel Pellegrini said after his team's 4-1 Premier League win at Sunderland on Wednesday.

Yaya Toure and Samir Nasri after champions City consolidated their position in second place in the table, six points behind leaders Chelsea. "Yaya played very well. Nasri after his injury gave a very

Chelsea preserved their sixpoint advantage at the Premier League summit by beating Tottenham Hotspur 3-0 on Wednesday, while

Manchester City kept pace with a 4-1 success at Sunderland.

Southampton's last-gasp 1-0 loss at Arsenal left defending champions City with a four-point cushion in second place, and the ease of the leading pair's victories suggests the gap is only likely to increase.

Chelsea had been held to a goalless draw at Sunderland at the weekend, but they returned to winning ways against Tottenham, who have not won at Stamford Bridge since February 1990.

Chelsea were missing top scorer Diego Costa due to suspension, but after Spurs striker Harry Kane had rattled the crossbar with an early header, the hosts went ahead in the 19th minute.

Eden Hazard picked the ball up wide on the left, swapped passes with Costa's replacement, Didier Drogba, and beat visiting goalkeeper Hugo Lloris at his near post with a powerful left-foot shot.

It was a disappointing moment for the France goalkeeper, and there was more frustration to come three minutes later.

Lloris fluffed a goal-kick straight to

on Wednesday. Sevilla romped to a 6-1 win in their last-32, first leg at Sabadell at the end of October, when Aspas also netted a treble, and after winning the return 5-1 they will play

Andalusian rivals Granada or Cordoba next month for a place in the quarterfinals. Sabadell took a surprise lead in the 22nd minute at the Sanchez Pizjuan stadium in Seville when Juan Collantes converted a penalty before Kevin Gameiro struck for the home side 10 minutes before halftime.

Aspas, who is on loan from English Premier League club Liverpool, scored three goals in four minutes midway through the second half to underline Sevilla's dominance and substitute Gerard Deulofeu completed the rout in the 81st.

"Let's see if this can become a habit," Aspas, who has been unable to nail down a regular starting place in coach Unai Emery's side, told reporters.

"These three goals will do me good to keep on gaining in confidence," added the 27-year-old.


pions Atletico, who beat Real 2-1 after extra time in the 2013 Cup final at the Bernabeu, won 3-0 at third-tier Hospitalet.

# Drogba sets the tone

Jose Mourinho believes Didier Drogba's dynamic display in Chelsea's 3-0 win over Tottenham

proved the Premier League leaders have the strength in depth to last the pace in the title race.

Mourinho's side maintained their six-point lead at the top of the table thanks to a throwback performance from Ivory Coast striker Drogba, who scored his fifth goal of the season at Stamford Bridge on Wednesday to make the absence of suspended leading scorer Diego Costa a mere footnote.

Drogba, 36, showed there is still plenty of life in his ageing legs by laying on Eden Hazard's 19th minute opener, then netting with a clinical finish in the 23rd minute before substitute Loic Remy's fine finish in the 73rd minute sealed Chelsea's seventh successive home win.

Even Mourinho, who brought

Drogba to west London from Marseille record, set previously in 2007 and for his first spell with the club in 2004, was moved to single out the Blues legend for special praise after a performance which showed Chelsea should have enough firepower in reserve if the injury-prone Costa falters.

"Yes, it is remarkable. Didier is a team player, one of these with an old school mentality. Not selfish, not vain, a humble guy who plays for the team, fights for the team. Fantastic," Mourinho said.

"When he is on the bench and comes on for the last few minutes to help the team defend, he does that with the same enthusiasm as when he starts a game against Tottenham.

"We played against him when he was at Galatasaray last season so I could feel the kind of potential he still has and I was expecting exactly this, with not even a doubt about a player who is not playing every game. I knew he would adapt very well mentally to his role."

Thanks to Drogba's inspirational efforts, Chelsea have equalled a club

again in 2009, by extending their unbeaten run to 23 matches in all competitions -- 21 this term and two games at the end of last season. They have also matched the club's

record unbeaten start to a league season of 14 games without defeat set in the second tier in 1925-26. Mourinho puts his team's scintillat-

ing form down to their refusal to look for excuses when they are hit by bad luck or injuries and suspensions. "We need him (Costa) but we have the right mentality. If we don't have a

player we don't cry about it," Mourinho said. "(Nemanja) Matic is suspended for the Newcastle game on Saturday? No

problem. Did you remember Diego Costa today? I didn't. "We give confidence to the players

and they respond in the best way.

"We were able to face a difficult moment against Tottenham, be stable, score the goals and then manage the game."

### High Noon showdown

Borussia Dortmund's Jurgen Klopp is set to make changes for Friday's home clash with Hoffenheim, which he describes as a "High Noon" showdown with his side bot-

tom of the Bundesliga. Dortmund are enduring the worst start to

a league season in their history. Their 2-0 loss at Eintracht Frankfurt last Sunday was their eighth defeat in 13 league games to put them back on the bottom of

the Bundesliga table. But Klopp says his side must show their mettle and has threatened to make changes against seventh-placed Hoffenheim with Dortmund having claimed only 11 from a possible 39 points.

"Friday is our High Noon. We have to

show what we are made of, " Klopp said. "We are trying to find out in training who can withstand this situation and will make our selection accordingly.

"We have a tremendous opportunity to emerge stronger from the crisis, without having been divided during this difficult period."

With Dortmund already through to the Champions League's last 16 before Tuesday's home match against Anderlecht, Klopp knows their problems come down to attitude.
