


BANGLADESH RMG 2021: \$50 Billion on 50th Anniversary of Bangladesh

DHAKA APPAREL SUMMIT 2014

Bangladesh readymade garments & textiles industry, the second largest readymade garment exporter in the world, is honored to share the first ever vision to reach US\$50 billion on 50th anniversary of Bangladesh. This all encompassing vision aims to bring all garment manufacturing and supporting entities under one roof with a common goal: the goal to fully realize the growth potential of the industry through sustainable development and dedicated

collaboration of all concerned stakeholders.

This vision to reach US\$50 by the year 2021 is based on an in-depth analysis of the industry's growth potential by the world's leading strategy consulting firm McKinsey & Co. In April of 2012 it published "Bangladesh's Ready Made Garments Landscape: The Challenge of Growth". McKinsey made a forecast that Bangladesh RMG could reach \$30bn by 2015 and \$50bn by 2021 and noted 'While China is starting to lose its attractiveness in this realm, the sourcing caravan is moving on to the next hot spot. With Bangladesh having developed a strong position amongst European and US buyers, many companies are already eager to evaluate the future potential'.

In the aftermath of Rana Plaza, in the latest report of Apparel CPO Survey 2013, McKinsey reiterated that the RMG sector of Bangladesh still held a competitive position. In addition, several other reports showcased certain facts that indicated that the sector was not only trying hard to maintain the required global standards, but in fact, in some cases, it was far exceeding the standards set by the competing countries.

To lay the foundation to the vision, Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) is jointly organizing a 3-day event "Bangladesh RMG 2021 - 50 Billion USD in 50 Years" with Alliance, American Apparel & Footwear Association (AAFA), German Development Cooperation (GIZ) and Bangladesh Brand Forum (BBF) during 7 to 9 December 2014 at the Bangabandhu International Conference Center (BICC) in Dhaka.

The event is purposed to chalk out a sustainable road map for the ready-made garment industry

to reach USD50 Billion exports by 2021 when Bangladesh would be celebrating her 50th Anniversary. This unique engagement will inspire the industry and its valued stakeholders to put forward their best effort in realizing the vision and take the sector forward. The summit will feature a number of panel sessions over two days participated by representatives of governments of home and partner countries, international organizations, employers, private sectors, workers' representatives, civil society organizations, brand representatives and buyers, academics and media.

The aim of these sessions is to lay the foundation for the roadmap to the Bangladesh RMG 2021 vision. Addressing the challenges, identifying the scopes, and amassing the desired response from concerned stakeholders are the objectives of these sessions. The roadmap to the vision can only be drawn with the collaborative effort of the participants.

In addition to the sessions the summit will also showcase GORBO, The grand finale of the voice talent hunt for the RMG workers; 2nd Social and Environmental Excellence (SEE) Award; International Trade Expo for Building and Fire Safety; and launching of Center of Excellence for Bangladesh Apparel Industry (CEBAI).


I hope the summit will be instrumental in outlining the ways forward to realize our vision of \$50 billion RMG exports by 2021.
