The People's Republic of Bangladesh has received a grant financing from Multi Donor Trust Fund (Grant No: TF 097134-BD) administered by the World Bank towards the cost of the **Strengthening Parliamentary Oversight (SPO) Project** under a comprehensive program titled Strengthening Public Expenditure Management Program (SPEMP) being implemented by **Bangladesh Parliament Secretariat** and intends to apply part of the proceeds for **National Consultant (MIS)** to work with the Project Management and Coordination Unit (PMCU) as an **IT Expert**. Project Director, SPO Project now invites **eligible Bangladeshi nationals** to express their interest in providing the service as mentioned below along with required qualifications.

**2. Key Responsibilities:**  
The National Consultant (MIS) will be a member of project management and implementation team. The main responsibility of the National Consultant (MIS) is to provide technical and advisory services regarding MIS developed by the MISC firm. His/her duties will include, but not be limited to, the following: 1. Overall monitoring of newly developed MIS for the business processes of the Financial Oversight Committees (FOCs) of Bangladesh Parliament. 2. Analyse the requirements of the Bidder and understand the features of existing MIS to identify the gaps with a view to extend the functionality of the existing MIS. 3. Confirm development of a core group of MIS experts to support the introduction of the new business processes and to facilitate the required change in organization culture 4. Provide proper advice and guidance to the project management and Parliament Secretariat regarding MIS based business processes of FOCs. 5. Liaison between project and MISC firm/ stake holders so that the project can achieve its targeted objectives. 6. Supervise and monitor the activities of the MISC firm. 7. Perform any other assignment required by the Project Director as and when required.

**3. Key qualifications and experiences:** 1. Masters Degree in Computer Science/ MBA(Major in MIS)/including B.Sc in Computer Science and Engineering. Advance degree in MIS/ proven skill in MIS operation will be an added advantage. 2. At least ten years' experience required in MIS /IT management of which at least five years in a managerial position in any government/semi-government / reputed large private and International organization. 3. Candidate must be fully conversant with and have hands on experience in Management Information System assisted business processes and system maintenance plan of MIS. 4. Extensive knowledge on System Analysis, Software Architecture, Project management, Software implementation and Software development. 5. Experience on MIS based business over Financial Oversight Committees of any Parliament will be added advantages. 6. Excellent communication and written skills in English is essentially required.

**4. Duration:** The assignment will commence tentatively from 1<sup>st</sup> February 2015 and will not exceed the remaining project implementation period up to 31 December 2015.

**Request for Expression of Interest for Selection of International Consulting Firm for Learning Assessment of Secondary Institutions (LASI)-2015**

**Learning Assessment of Secondary Institutions**

**I) Background**  
Secondary education in Bangladesh spans grades 6 to 10. Bangladesh has pursued a service delivery strategy in the secondary education sector which combines public financing with Private provision. Around 98% of schools are these aided non-government schools. 81% of the share of secondary enrollment is in secular aided government schools while 17% of the enrollment is in registered reformed aided non-government madrasahs. Secondary education is under the supervision of the Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education (DSHE) in the Ministry of Education.  
The Secondary Education Quality and Access Enhancement Project (SEQAEP) with the IDA financing (credit 5325-BD), which started in 2008 in 122 upazilas throughout Bangladesh, emphasizes on the improvement of the education quality by introducing a series of academic support interventions and incentive schemes to improve the quality of education. One of the main objectives of the SEQAEP is to systematically measure the quality of learning by national curriculum-based numeracy and literacy testing on a sample basis. The results of these independent assessments will be fed back to policymakers and stakeholders to raise their awareness about the quality of education, and adjust quality-related policies and interventions accordingly. The long-term vision is to build the appropriate capacity to mainstream the assessment system.  
The Monitoring and Evaluation Wing (MEW) under DSHE led implementation of Learning Assessment of SEQAEP Institutions (LASI) in July 2012 and December 2013. Grade 9 students were tested in 2012 and grade 6 and 8 students were tested in 2013 in the subjects of Bangla, English and Math. The result of 2012 LASI was compiled in a report and nationally disseminated as a first systemic learning assessment in secondary education in the country. While these two rounds of LASI covered only SEQAEP upazilas, the Additional Financing of the SEQAEP which became effective in February 2014 aims to extend the successful pilots of LASI to nationwide coverage. Therefore, the LASI 2015 will be administered with a representative sample of all secondary institutions in the country, and will be renamed as Learning Assessment of Secondary Institutions (LASI).  
A part of the IDA fund will be utilized for payments of an International Firm for Consultancy Service for Learning Assessment of Secondary Institutions-2015 under the MEW. Under the package of \$40.1 MEW now invites eligible International Consulting Firm to submit their Expressions of Interest (EOI) for providing the services mentioned below:

**II) Objectives for the Consultancy**  
The primary objective of the consultancy is to help the MEW of DSHE implement the learning assessment in English, Mathematics, and Bangla at Grades 6 and 8 by providing technical expertise in developing the assessment tests and questionnaires, training the relevant government staff and survey implementers, and leading the analysis of the results. The assignment entails TA to support the government system, and it involves collaboration with the local firm that is responsible for administering the testing component.  
Another important objective of the consultancy is to establish learning trajectory of students in Bangladesh. Primary education is administered by MoPME, and secondary education is administered by MOE. As a result, the learning trajectory of Bangladeshi students is not well known because nobody has a global idea of how students' cognitive development occurs. It therefore important that this assignment will establish a learning trajectory by linking NSA and Learning Assessment of Secondary Institutions (LASI) 2015 which are taken place in grades 6 and 8 around the same time of NSA 2015. **This equating exercise is led by the primary education NSA team and its consultant, but the LASI team and this consultancy is required to coordinate and deliver necessary inputs for the equating work.**

**III) Tasks and Responsibilities for the Consultancy and Estimated Timeline**  
The consultant will be responsible for the following tasks in close consultation with the MEW, DSHE, and the Development Partners.

**IV) Tasks and responsibilities for the government**

- The MEW will be responsible for overall management of the assessment. The MEW will work in close consultation with the consultant at all times. The consultant will advise of appropriate processes and notify all parties of constraints to the successful operation of the SEQAEP learning assessment well in advance to enable corrective actions.
- The MEW will be responsible for providing the list of schools and their key characteristics for designing the sample. The MEW is also responsible for verifying the data when samples are drawn and obtaining permission to access sampled schools.
- MEW will be responsible for recruiting a local survey firm for the implementation of the tests. The local survey firm will be in charge of all logistics.
- The local firm will be responsible for publishing all documents including test instruments, questionnaires, and manuals.
- The MEW is responsible for conducting quality monitoring of the test administration based on the quality monitoring manual produced by the consultant.
- The MEW will be responsible for printing preliminary findings report and organising the workshop. It is also responsible for publishing the final report.
- The MEW will be responsible for ensuring that appropriately-skilled staff are available and committed to working with the consultant to systematically develop and apply their knowledge and skills to build institutional capacity in Bangladesh, with the aim to reduce dependence in future on international technical assistance.
- The MEW must commit to, and be responsible for, ensuring that all tasks for which they have responsibility are performed according to the timelines specified.

**V) Contract duration and timeline**  
This TOR is based on a consultancy requirement between December 2014 and June 2016. It is expected that varied types of expertise will be needed from the consultant, and so these working days will include the corresponding specialists to be called upon to respond to the identified needs. They would carry out their work through face-to-face assistance, email and telephone exchanges.
