Chief Justice Md Muzammel Hossain yesterday stressed the need for appointing adequate number of judges and manpower and increasing the number of courts in order to reduce the huge backlog of cases.

"The huge backlog of cases, which has taken place due to filing of scores of cases beyond the accommodation of courts of the country, is a major hurdle to getting justice by the people," he said. The Supreme Court took different steps to reduce the back-

log and disposal delay, he told as chief guest the 17th founding anniversary of Jatiya Samannita Unnayan Foundation (JSUF), a socio-economic development organisation, in the capital's Institute of Diploma Engineers, Bangladesh.

"The opportunity for the judges to get involved in social works is very limited. But judges are always engaged with the welfare of the society and the state through ensuring

DILAPIDATED GOVT PRY SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN BARISAL | Save Suma

60,000 students at risk

At least 60,000 students are taking classes at 189 government primary schools out of the total 1,513 in Barisal district putting themselves at the risk of accidents any moment due to the poor condition of the buildings.

These dilapidated structures mostly built during the last two decades have been in such conditions for around six years. But the Directorate of Primary Education, Barisal declared the buildings risky only this May.

Locals alleged that low quality construction materials caused the early dilapidation.

Towhidul Islam, the district primary education officer, said repair works started at 143 of the 189 schools in 1982. Under different projects, the Education Engineering Department first took the

responsibility and later handed the work over to the Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) in 1994, he said. Now, the LGED is continuing the work

under the three-year "Primary Education Development Project", which will end in June next year, he added. Around 40 percent to 60 percent of the

work is completed and the rest is expected to be finished within the stipulated time, said Towhidul. In the meantime, because of accommo-

dation crises, the students are compelled to attend classes in a number of vulnerable school buildings. This correspondent observed the conditions in recent visits to some schools in and outside the city.

On November 15, four students of the city's Kawnia Government Municipal Primary
