# Direct bus service with Nepal likely


Direct bus service between Dhaka and Kathmandu might start next year as Nepal has agreed in principle with a proposal made by Bangladesh to that end.

The government made the proposal last year considering the huge potential of the service, as a significant number of tourists visit Nepal and many students from the Himalayan country come to Bangladesh for higher studies every year.

A number of bus operators have already shown their interest to launch services on the route.

"We have already submitted a draft proposal to the Nepalese government. They are also interested in the direct bus service. It is under consideration of the Nepalese government," said Mashfee Binte Shams, Bangladesh High Commissioner to Nepal.

The Nepalese government had agreed in principle to launch the bus service and things would move faster after the Saarc Summit, she said when this correspondent met her along with a group of visiting Bangladeshis at the 'Bangladesh House' in Kathmandu last month.



There were a number of issues needed to be finalised through discussion at a joint technical committee level meeting before signing the protocol, she added.

Bangladesh has also submitted a proposed route map prepared by geographical information system experts of the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD).

According to the proposed route, distance between Dhaka and Kathmandu is 1,184 kilometres and the journey would take around 22 hours by bus.

#### THERMAL POWER PLANT Dhaka eyes joint venture in India

To bolster bilateral energy cooperation, Bangladesh has suggested setting up of a thermal power plant on a joint venture in India and allocation of a coal block to it.

According to a senior Bangladeshi official, the proposed plant would be in line of 1,320 MW thermal project in Rampal in Bagerhat -- being jointly developed by India's National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) and Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB).

In New Delhi, Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury, energy adviser to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, said the proposal of the joint venture was discussed during his meeting with Indian Power and Coal Minister Piyush Goyal on Wednesday.

### Agitation soon after energy price hike

Khaleda tells N'ganj rally

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday questioned why it would be an offence if people possess illegal arms as the ruling Awami League men "already have such firearms".

"Armed Awami League activists have been walking around in public. The government itself has supplied those illegal arms to its men who are involved in killings and extortion. Now, if people

also take up arms, why should they be barred as both sides would be in possession of illegal arms?"

She was addressing a mammoth public rally at Kanchpur Balur Math in Narayanganj. The BNP-led 20-party alliance hosted the rally as part of its ongoing campaign to drum up public support for holding a fresh election under a non-party administration.

"Stop right away supplying illegal arms to your [Hasina] men. Recover all illegal arms. Otherwise, the consequences would be very dangerous," warned the BNP chief.

### Troubled talks scrabble for exit strategy

Negotiations on forging a UN pact to fight climate change headed into an unscheduled 13th day yesterday in a frantic quest to bridge a rift between rich and poor coun-

Ministers and senior officials from 195 states were to examine a compromise for calming a bust-up over who bears responsibility for fighting climate change.

The talks in Lima had been scheduled to end at 6:00 pm (2300 GMT) Friday, but ran into the pre-dawn as countries horse-traded over elements of a draft text.


