

# HOMAGE TO MARTYRS

People from all strata of life celebrated the 44th anniversary of the country's liberation through an array of programmes yesterday. The National Memorial at Savar, outside the capital, was one of the main hubs, where the general public exulted (1), while President Abdul Hamid and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina stood in silence honouring the martyrs (2). Leader of the Opposition Raushan Ershad (3) and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia (4) paid floral tributes. At the National Parade Ground, a host of events were arranged including marches by the military, paramilitary and non-military forces (5). Suhrawardy Udyan was another hub where Sector Commanders Forum re-enacted the moments of the Pakistani army's surrender on the historic ground (6), and handed over the national flag to youths in a symbolic transfer of their responsibilities towards the sovereign country (8). The ground drew a huge, variegated crowd (10) including people with disabilities (7) and foreigners (9). In Chittagong city, youths turn into living statues depicting the Liberation War (11).














#### 2-day int'l lit conference on World Wars at DU tomorrow

Receiving the flag at SCF's programme, Ishrat Jerin Tisha, a higher secondary student, said, "Our forefathers gifted us an independent country. Similarly, we want to gift a prosperous country to our descendants."

"We, the youths, must remain alert and ready to make maximum sacrifices like the freedom fighters did in 1971," said Abu Bakar Siddique, a law

student of Dhaka University. Freedom fighter M Hamid said, "We want that our next generation grows up in the spirit of Liberation

War so that they can uphold the dignity of our national flag."

The Dhaka city unit of AL brought out a huge procession from Shikha Chiranton near the Institution of Engineers, which paraded through Shahbagh, Elephant Road, Science Laboratory, Mirpur Road, Kalabagan, and Russell Square before reaching the party chief's Dhanmondi office.

The march was joined by thousands of activists from the party's "If we can't inject that spirit in associated bodies including Jubo

League, Mohila League, Mohila Jubo League, Sramik League, Swechchhasebak League, and inflicted immense sufferings on commuters because of the traffic chaos it created.

The participants carried national flags, replicas of tanks, guns, fighter planes and boats, placards and banners, and demanded banning of Jamaat-e-Islami and elimination of Razakars.

and painting competitions. Border Guard Bangladesh held a doa mahfil, and placed wreaths at



Alongside other organisations and individuals, Amra Muktijoddhar Sontan placed a wreath at the National Memorial in Savar, outside Dhaka, and demanded banning of Jamaat.

The Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies of Dhaka University arranged a poster exhibition and cultural programme, and called for the quick execution of Jamaat leader Kamaruzzaman, who was sentenced to die for war crimes.

Maulana Bhasani Science and Technology University, Bangabandhu Sangskritik Jote, Bangabandhu Gobeshona Parishad, and Zaker Party held different programmes to mark the day.
