RECRUITMENT AT CAG TIB worried at ministers' 'interference'

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) yesterday expressed concern over some ministers' intervention in the ongoing recruitment process at the office of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG).

Six ministers, two state ministers, chairman of a parliamentary standing committee and one central leader of the ruling party have made written recommendations and created pressure on officials to recruit certain candidates at the CAG, it said.

According to the anticorruption watchdog, 10,000 candidates out of 16,000 have passed the written test for 36 posts at the CAG. "Against such a back-

Two NY cops shot dead

Gunman kills himself AGENCIES

A gunman shot dead two New York City police officers and then killed himself, police said, after a social media post indicated he may having been seeking revenge for the death of an unarmed black man during an arrest attempt.

The two New York City Police Department officers, Rafael Ramos, 40, and Wenjian Liu, 32, were ambushed in their patrol car Saturday afternoon, said NYPD Police Commissioner William Bratton.

"They were quite simply assassinated, targeted for their uniforms," he told a news conference after the attack, the first in which NYPD officers had been killed by gunfire since 2011.

India to hand OIL SPILL in SUNDARBANS over Nur Hossain soon

India is likely to hand over Nur Hossain, the main accused in the Narayanganj seven-murder case, soon, said Mozammel Huq Khan, secretary of the home ministry.

"We have directed the police to take all necessary measures to bring him back following India's external affairs ministry's letter last week." In the letter, India wanted to know where and when it could hand over Nur who is now imprisoned in Kolkata.

He was arrested with two other Bangladeshis in a Kolkata apartment on June 14 for not having any document required for entering the country.

Stop movement of vessels in Shela

Govt probe body 'recommends', calls for continuous monitoring to assess impact

A government committee probing the Sundarbans oil spill has recommended a permanent halt to the operation of cargo vessels through the Shela river in the mangrove forest, said one of its members yesterday.

It also suggested conducting periodic studies to assess long-term impact of the oil spill from the December 9 sinking of a tanker in the river, he added, wishing not to be named.

"The probe committee didn't find very severe immediate impact of the accident. But we have recommended conducting a continuous close moni-

toring as the forest is very sensitive."

Additional Secretary Nurul Karim, who leads the seven-member committee, said they had finalised the probe report. Now it requires signatures of some members who live in Khulna.

He declined to say anything more about the report. The committee comprising environment and mangrove experts and government officials was formed immediately after the Southern Star-7 sank having been hit by a cargo vessel.

Talking to some members of the committee, The Daily Star learnt that a quarter has been trying to SEE PAGE 11 COL 5

Black, white tomatoes grow in same plant



For their latest creation, the green-fingered gardeners blended Indigo Rose with a white-cherry SEE PAGE 2 COL 4



Cuban President Raul Castro said Saturday he was ready to discuss any topic with Washington after the historic bilateral rapprochement, but warned not to expect political change.

And while the leader of the Americas' only communist nation hailed the agreement for removing of an "obstacle" in US-Cuba relations, he reiterated that "the most

embargo" remained unresolved.

Castro spoke at the close of the twice-yearly meeting of the oneparty National Assembly, which unanimously ratified the deal between Havana and Washington, in a session largely focused on the island's historic renewal of ties with Washington.


