Police fired 18 rubber bullets and brought the situation under control 15 minutes later, he said.

A witness yesterday said she saw fugitive war crimes accused Syed Hasan Ali accompanied by Razakars and the Pakistani army attack the house of her neighbour Hachu Bepari in Tarail of Kishoreganj in 1971 since he was an adherent of the Awami League.
