Six killed as lorry collides with train

Lorry driver tries to cross tracks defying signals; all the dead are train passengers, 15 hurt

Defying signals, a lorry drove onto the rail tracks and collided with a passenger train inside Kamalapur Railway Station's container depot yesterday, leaving at least six people killed and 15 others injured.

Two died on the spot and four, including a woman, at Dhaka Medical College Hospital. All were passengers of the train, coming to the capital from Narayanganj, said police and locals.

Law enforcers were still searching for the lorry driver, suspected to be the main culprit behind the accident.

An official of NS Cargo Ltd that owns the lorry said they lost contacts with driver Rahmat and his helper Ripon soon after the incident.

As the train was approaching the Inland Container Depot at the station around 12:45pm, the lorry driver hurriedly tried to cross the railway line ignoring warnings, said Nizam, a depot labourer who witnessed the incident.

But the lorry failed to cross the line and the train rammed its rear. On impact, the vehicle spun and crashed onto the train's first compartment, he said.

The train dragged the lorry for around 50 yards.

Rail communications between Dhaka and Narayanganj remained suspended till 7:00pm following the accident.

The lorry was moving towards the west side of the depot from the east. Both gates on the railway line inside the depot SEE PAGE 2 COL 2

China identifies them for investment in Bangladesh

China has identified commerce, agriculture, industrial development, energy, and infrastructure development sectors of Bangladesh for its high priority investment and support.

It also promised to stand by Bangladesh during its "emergency needs".

First 'digital university' in the offing

Cabinet decides to set it up in Gazipur

Bangladesh is going to get its first "digital university" at Kaliakair of Gazipur to help improve the standard of information and communication technology education in the country.

A weekly cabinet meeting held at the secretariat with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair approved the proposal yesterday for setting up the public university beside the Hi-tech Park in the district.

The cabinet approved in principle the draft of "Digital University, Bangladesh Act, 2014" which proposed establishing the university to be named after the Father of the Nation
