Lampard stays at Man City

English Premier League champions Manchester City announced on Wednesday they had secured the services of Frank Lampard until the end of the season despite the midfielder signing for New York City in June.

"Manchester City can confirm that it has extended Frank Lampard's contract up to the end of Manchester City's season, enabling his continued participation in both domestic and European campaigns," said a statement on the club's website.

England star Lampard has scored six goals in 17 appearances for City this season after signing on loan from the fledgling MLS club. The US team said the

date he will join them will be revealed "as the Premier League and MLS seasons unfold". New York City FC direc-

tor of football Claudio Reyna said: "Frank is a star and it is no surprise Manchester City is rewarded by his contributions on the field every single day.

"He is eager to get to New York once his commitment ends in England and will be available to play on arrival as a permanent member of the squad, given he will come to us having played at the highest level."

Lampard nets crucial winner

Frank Lampard celebrated his loan extension by scoring the winning goal as Manchester City edged Sunderland 3-2 on

Thursday to move level on points with Premier League leaders Chelsea.

City announced late on Wednesday that Lampard's loan move from their sister club New York City FC had been prolonged to the end of the season and he proved his worth by coming off the bench to score the winner.

City, who left goalkeeper Joe Hart on the bench, took the lead in the 57th minute at the Etihad Stadium when Yaya Toure slammed an exquisite shot into the top-left corner from outside the box.

Stevan Jovetic's flick made it 2-0, but just as they had done in Sunday's 2-2 draw with Burnley, the champions allowed

Sunderland back into the game.

Two City old boys did the damage, with Jack Rodwell's header reducing the arrears in the 68th minute and Adam Johnson equalising from the penalty spot three minutes later after Pablo Zabaleta had fouled Santiago Vergini.

But just three minutes after replacing Jovetic, Lampard headed home a cross from Gael Clichy to take City level with his former club Chelsea, who visit Tottenham Hotspur in the late New Year's Day fixture.

Earlier, Manchester United had lost further momentum in the title race after drawing 1-1 with Stoke City at a windy Britannia Stadium.

Radamel Falcao equalised for the visitors in the 26th minute after former United trainee Ryan Shawcross had scored the first goal of 2015 in the second minute by hooking home from Peter Crouch's header.

United remain third, but will fall 12 points off the pace if Chelsea win at White Hart Lane. Southampton tightened their grip on fourth place and closed to within a point of United by winning 2-0 at home to nearest rivals Arsenal, who fell three points off the Champions League places as a result.

Sadio Mane curled home from a narrow

angle on the right after Arsenal goalkeeper

Wojciech Szczesny went walkabout in the 34th minute, with Dusan Tadic adding a second in the 56th minute after a defensive mix-up. Freshly appointed West Bromwich

Albion manager Tony Pulis watched from the stands as his new club drew 1-1 at West Ham United, with Saido Berahino cancelling out Diafra Sakho's neatly constructed 10th-minute opener.

The result kept West Brom a point above the relegation zone.

Tevez not keen on Juve stay

Argentina striker Carlos Tevez, quizzed over the chances of him returning to Boca Juniors, has no plans to sign a contract extension with Juventus.

The Italian champions reportedly want to offer Tevez, whose contract runs until June 2016, a deal to stay in Turin to 2018.

"I said I wanted to fulfil my contract and that's my idea, I'm not thinking of signing an extension because that's not how I feel at the moment," Tevez told reporters in Buenos Aires on Wednesday before returning to Turin from the year-end holidays.

"As I always said, my idea is to complete my contract. Everyone knows I said so from the moment I arrived at Juve."

West Bromwich appoint Pulis



Tony Pulis has been appointed as the new head coach of West Bromwich Albion on a two-and-a-halfyear contract, the Premier League strugglers announced on Thursday.

The 56-year-old former Stoke City and Crystal Palace manager replaces Alan Irvine, who was sacked on Monday after a run of seven defeats in nine matches that left the club just a point above the relegation zone.

"I'm absolutely delighted to accept the job and I do so with a simple but important message for the Albion fans and everyone at the club," the Welshman said in a statement on the club website.

"Every successful club is built on unity and that is what I shall strive to help bring to Albion. We need everyone together from top to bottom -- the supporters, all the staff, the players, everyone who has an interest in the club's welfare.

"With that, we can go forward together and hopefully take this club up the Premier League."

Pulis was named the Premier League's Manager of the Year for steering Palace away from relegation last season, but he left the club on the eve of the current campaign after falling out with chairman Steve Parish.

gave him the edge. "We are delighted to secure a man of Tony's calibre and proven ability," West

Brom technical director Terry Burton said.

"He made it clear that this position excited him and that he was eager to get back into the business of winning Premier League points -- and there are few who know

how to do it better." Irvine, 56, was the second Premier League manager to be sacked this season following Neil Warnock's dismissal by Palace last Saturday.

Pulis made his name during two spells at Stoke, guiding the club to promotion from



the Championship in 2008.

He turned Stoke into an established Premier League side with a reputation for rugged, uncompromising football and guided them to five consecutive top-14

finishes before stepping down in 2013. Palace were six points from safety at the foot of the table when he took over in November 2013, but he engineered a vast improvement in their performances that

saw them finish the season in 11th place. However, despite receiving many end-ofseason plaudits, a disagreement with the Palace hierarchy over the club's recruitment strategy saw him leave Selhurst Park by "mutual consent" in August.

Bruce won't succeed Pardew

Hull City manager Steve Bruce on Wednesday ruled himself out of the running to succeed Alan Pardew, who is believed to be on the verge of leaving Newcastle United.

Pardew has been given permission to speak to Crystal Palace, who sacked Neil Warnock at the weekend, and is reported to have said his farewells to Newcastle's staff and players at their training ground on Tuesday.

Bruce, 54, was a boyhood Newcastle fan and has previously expressed regret over rejecting a chance to manage the club in 2004, but he says that he

is fully committed to Hull. "People know that I am from Newcastle, I was a Newcastle supporter as a boy and it has been regurgitated since I was a 22year-old playing for Norwich and Gillingham," he told a press conference.

"For that obvious reason, every time I am linked with them. It's very flattering as I'm a Geordie, but that's it.

"I have a job to do here and it would be wrong for me to think of anything else other than get this club out of the position we are in and that's all I am focused on."

Hull are currently above the Premier League relegation zone on goal difference alone and host Everton on New Year's Day.
