



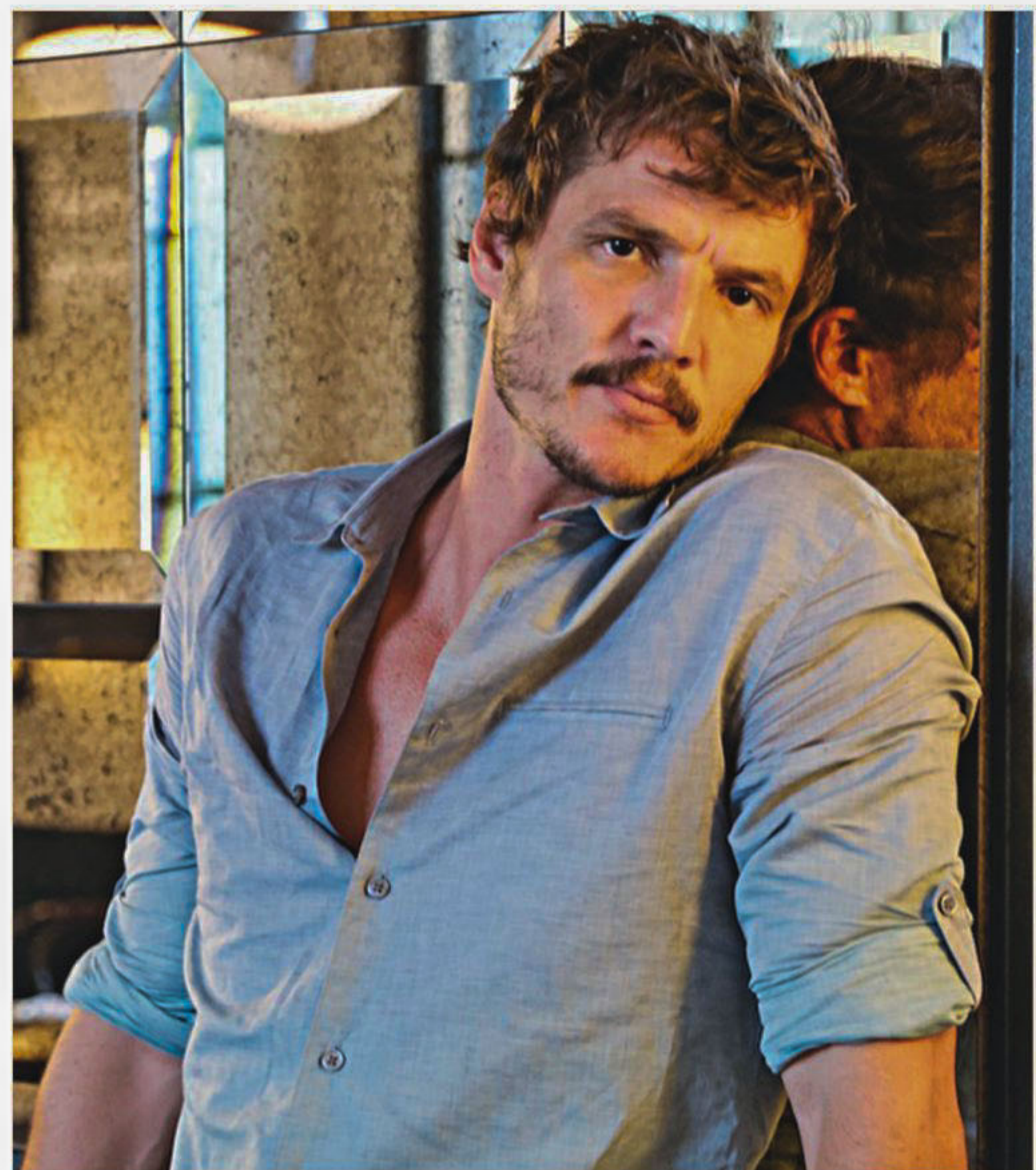
## ALIA BHATT PREFERS 'UDTA PUNJAB' OVER 'ROCK ON 2'?
