

No German envoy in Dhaka for 7 months

Diplomatic amity not at its best

There has been no German ambassador in Bangladesh for the last seven months because of Dhaka's reluctance to accept the proposed appointment of a new envoy who reportedly made some remarks displeasing the Sheikh Hasina-administration. Diplomatic sources said the German government

appointed career diplomat Dr Gabriela Guellil as its next ambassador to Bangladesh in July 2014 but Dhaka did not respond to the agrément, the official naming of a new

Admitting the incident, a high official at the foreign ministry yesterday said, " ... remaining silent on any agrément means rejection."

The official declined to say anything about the reason behind the rejection but hinted that before her name was proposed, Dr Guellil, then German ambassador in Cyprus, made some "comments going against Dhaka" and so it declined to accept her appointment.

What she said was not shared by the foreign ministry officials.

As per the Vienna Convention of Diplomatic Relations 1961, the receiving country can reject any proposed name without showing any reason, said the officials.

Three cases were filed against BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir and many other leaders of the BNPled 20-party alliance in connection with torching vehicles and blasting crude bombs in the capital's Motijheel and Paltan areas on Sunday.

In the cases, Fakhrul and BNP leader Mirza Abbas were shown "instigators".

Earlier on December 30, another case was filed against Fakhrul and 42 other leaders of the alliance for torching a government bus at Paltan intersection on the day before.

Of the cases filed on Sunday, two were filed

with Paltan Police Station against Fakhrul and 28 other leaders of the alliance, and the Leader of the Opposition remaining one with Motijheel Police Station against Fakhrul and 80 others.

of Sergeant Ahad Police Box filed one of the cases against Fakhrul and 28 others for torching a vehicle in front of Hawkers' Market on Bangabandhu Avenue.

Police Station filed another case against the same people for torching a vehicle in front of Azad Products Ltd.
