UK sends expert to work on Sundarbans oil clean-up

Mark Whittington, an expert adviser from the International Tanker Owners Pollution Federation, arrived in Dhaka yesterday to work on oil clean-up operation in the Sundarbans, the largest mangrove forest in the world.

He will work with the government of Bangladesh and the UN to implement recommendations made by a recently completed assessment in the forest.

At the request of the UN and the government, the UK will provide fund for the expert adviser in this regard, says a press release of British High Commission in Dhaka.

A tanker carrying 3.58 lakh litres of furnace oil sank in a Sundarbans river near Mongla on December 9 last year, spilling oil over a vast area of the forest.

Injured Bangladeshi peacekeeper brought back home

Rab not responsible for members' past crimes

New DG Benazir declares to media after taking over

The new director general of the Rapid Action Battalion, Benazir Ahmed, yesterday said his force would not take the responsibility for past criminal activities committed by its members.

"Those were isolated incidents and committed in an individual capacity. Rab will not own it," he told reporters, while answering to a query on whether some officials' alleged involvement in the murder of seven people in Narayanganj besmirched the force's image.

Three officials were sacked from Rab and arrested after the family of one victim accused them of committing the seven murders in exchange for Tk 6 crore in April last year.

Speaking to the press at Rab headquarters in the capital after taking his new role, Benazir hinted at reform in the elite counter-terrorist force, created in 2004. "Time has come to change the mandate of Rab," he said, adding that it would be made stronger with sophisti-

cated technologies. Benazir had held the office of the commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police for over four years, before being appointed Rab's chief in late December.

The Rab has earned much acclaim in curbing militancy but its members faced widespread allegations of extra-judicial killings and torture in custody.

Dhaka in awkward situation over lawsuit against NY diplomat

US court refuses to drop charges

Dhaka is facing an embarrassing situation following Tuesday's rejection by a US court of a Bangladesh diplomat and his wife's request to dismiss a lawsuit a former domestic worker filed accusing them of forcing him to work without any pay in slavery-like conditions.

"The foreign ministry is disturbed at the incident related to its diplomat Monirul Islam," a senior foreign ministry official told The Daily Star yesterday.

A former New York consul general, Monirul is now serving as Bangladesh ambassador to Morocco, moving there shortly after the case was filed with Manhattan Federal Court on March 21, 2014 seeking back pay and unspecified punitive damages.

Following a similar case centring Devyani Khobragade, once India's deputy consul general in New York,
