Violence may hurt investors' confidence

Says int'l credit rating agency Fitch

The political violence that erupted this month may dent investor confidence in Bangladesh, said Fitch, one of the three most important credit rating agencies in the world.

"Renewed political tensions and violence in Bangladesh in the first week of January may negatively affect foreign investor confidence, raising risks to growth over the long term," said Fitch Ratings yesterday.

If violence were to persist and directly disrupt economic activity, especially by inflicting long-term harm to the key readymade garment (RMG) sector, this would be credit negative, the Singapore-based US rating agency said.

Fitch is one of the three rating agencies which periodically do sovereign ratings of Bangladesh. The other two are Moody's and Standard & Poor's.

Fitch had highlighted substantial political risk -- linked to continued polarisation between the governing and opposition parties -- as a key source of uncertainty for Bangladesh's economic outlook when it assigned the country a "BB-" longterm foreign currency issuer default rating in August 2014.

Probe recent killings, stop arbitrary arrest of politicians

Amnesty, HRW ask govt STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch have said the Bangladesh government should investigate the recent killing of protesters and stop "arbitrary" arrests of members of opposition parties.

The London-based Amnesty International in a report dated January 8 on its website also said the Bangladeshi authorities must free a "prominent journalist" arrested this week as part of an apparent crackdown against the BNP.

"The government of Bangladesh has a duty to launch an immediate, thorough and independent investigation into the deaths [of protesters] and bring those responsible to justice," Abbas Faiz, Bangladesh researcher at the organisation, said in the report.

"These arrests represent clear violations of the rights to freedom of

4 Qaeda militants killed in Pakistan

'Bangladeshi' among the dead

Pakistani police yesterday said they had shot dead four regional al-Qaeda militants including a senior leader in an early morning encounter in the port city of Karachi.

The leader, named as "Sajjad" -- also known as Kargil -was said to be a Bangladeshi who moved to Pakistan in 2009 and specialised in making IEDs and suicide jackets.

He was also the Karachi commander of al-Qaeda in South Asia, a new branch of the global militant outfit that launched last September, a local police official said.
