## Ctg teacher killed on way to college

Criminals hack her in broad daylight

Unidentified assailants hacked to death a female teacher of Chittagong Nursing College in broad daylight in the city's Chawkbazar yesterday morning.


The dead Anjali Devi, 57, wife of Dr Rajendra Chowdhury, was a senior teacher of the college on the Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) campus. She along with her family used to live in a rented house at Gaser Goli of Telipatti under Panchlaish Police Station.

Rajendra said Anjali left home around 8:30am for her college. Within 15 minutes, the guard of the house informed him that his wife was stabbed by some youths.

"When I reached the spot, which is around 30-40 yards off the house, I saw my wife lying in a pool of blood. I took her to the CMCH by a CNG-run auto-rickshaw."

Quoting witness Mohammad Yasin, Panchlaish police said four youths attacked Anjali while she was waiting at Telipatti intersection for a rickshaw.

Locals could not come to save the teacher as the attackers were equipped with sharp weapons and firearms. As Yasin started hurling brick chips at the criminals, they ran away, SEE PAGE 10 COL 4

# Padma bridge site abuzz with activities

16pc work on approach roads, rehabilitation done

The construction work of Padma Multipurpose Bridge seems to be going on at a good pace.

About 16 percent of the infrastructure work of the project, including approach roads, rehabilitation and development of the project area, is complete, according to ministry data.

During a recent visit to the site, large barges were seen ready to lift heavy construction equipment. Earth-moving equipment were being used for road construction. Army personnel were seen busy giving directives to workers and

monitoring approach road work.

A few kilometres away, houses were being built for the construction yard workers and the officers. Around 300 Chinese and a few hundred local workers were working there.

Sand, stones and bricks have been piled up, trucks were constantly arriving with loads of bricks, sand, cement, stones and soil.

Soil testing was being carried out for the main bridge. The next step would be to conduct piling tests and after that the construction work of the bridge would begin.

Paris yesterday, beefing up security on the eve of a march expected to draw more than a million in tribute to 17 victims of a three-TODAY'S POLL day Islamist killing spree.

> Fears remained acute and security levels were kept at France's highest level as the girlfriend of one of three gunmen killed in a fiery climax to twin hostage dramas on Friday remained on the loose.

But refusing to be cowed, people poured onto the streets in cities around France in poignantly silent marches paying tribute to those killed in the nation's bloodiest week

in more than half a century.

The marches in the cities of Nice, Pau and France deployed hundreds of troops around Orleans were a taste of what was to come in Paris today, where a monster rally will be held for national unity, to be attended by President Francois Hollande and a host of world leaders.

#### Ship surveyor suspended once again

The ship surveyor held responsible for Pinak launch disaster has been suspended once again following a High Court order.

"We have suspended Mirza Saifur Rahman again on December 24 following the court's order," said Commodore M Zakiur Rahman Bhuiyan, director general of Department of Shipping.

The overcrowded launch operating on an illegal temporary permit sank in the Padma killing more than a hundred passengers in early August last year.

The DoS suspended the surveyor in September as a ministerial committee had held him directly responsible for the disaster.

However, Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan started pressing the DoS to reinstate Mirza to "ensure navigational safety".

#### 3 of a family killed as truck rams bike in Tangail

Three members of a family, including a woman and her daughter, were killed as a truck rammed their motorbike at Mozidpur in Ghatail upazila yesterday.

The dead are Sumon Miah, 28, son of Abdul Aziz of Pachh Charan village in Kalihati upazila, his sister Asma Begum, 30, and her daughter Maria, 4.

The accident happened on Tangail-Gopalpur road around 4:30pm when the Gopalpur-bound truck hit the motorbike and ran it over. Sumon was taking Asma and her daughter to his house from Asma's inlaws'. The three died on the spot, said Mokhlesur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Ghatail Police Station. Both the driver and

helper of the vehicle managed to flee, leaving the truck on the spot, he said.

The bodies were handed over to the victims' family, the police official added.
