World unites against terror

Leaders join mammoth procession in Paris defending freedom of speech, condemning extremism

AFP, Paris

More than a million people thronged the streets of Paris yesterday in the biggest rally in French history, led by dozens of world leaders walking arm-in-arm as cries of "Freedom" and "Charlie" rang out across the country.

The interior ministry said 3.7 million people took to the streets nationwide, with Paris alone seeing an "unprecedented" 1.5 million demonstrators.

In the capital, President Francois Hollande linked arms

with world leaders, including the Israeli prime minister and the Palestinian president, in an historic display of unity. A sea of humanity flowed through Paris' iconic streets to mourn the victims of the three days of terror that began with

Hebdo and ended with 17 dead. The vast crowd chanted "Charlie, Charlie", in honour of the cartoonists and journalists killed at Charlie Hebdo over

a slaughter at the offices of satirical magazine Charlie

its lampooning of the Prophet Mohammed. Emotions ran high in the grieving City of Light, with many of those marching in tears as they came together under the banner of freedom of speech after France's worst terrorist bloodbath in half a century.

The crowd brandished banners saying: "I'm French and I'm not scared" and, in tribute to the murdered cartoonists, "Make fun, not war" and "Ink should flow, not blood."

Isabelle Dahmani, a French Christian married to a Muslim, Mohamed, brought the couple's three young children to show them there is nothing to fear. GERMAN PAPER ATTACKED - PAGE 8

Election pledges left ignored

The ruling Awami League appears to have been reluctant to deliver on its electoral pledges on good governance, democratisation and decentralisation of power. Its inaction in general and excess use of power in some cases has rather worsened the situation in its first year in office.

In the run-up to the one-sided January 5 parliamentary polls, the AL had said it

would take more than a dozen measures to improve the governance. After leading her party to an easy win with three-fourth majority, AL chief Sheik Hasina formed her cabinet on January 12 last year amid an unprecedented scale of political turmoil.

One of the crucial electoral pledges was to take steps to create a national consensus among political parties, professional bodies and civil societies on basic issues like

Three bombs found at courtrooms Panic in SC area

Raising serious concern over security at the apex court, three bombs were recovered from a Supreme Court building yesterday.

The explosives were found in two courtrooms on the first floor of the SC's annex building where proceedings of the High Court take place.

Police were yet to arrest anyone in connection with the incident that created panic among judges, lawyers and court staffs.

Each of the bombs, weighing around 500 grams, contains explosive substances, and is more powerful than usual crude bombs, said Rahmatullah Chowdhury, senior

BIWTA boss 'behind river grabbing'

Foreshores leased out flouting HC orders; ACC probe on

In complete defiance of orders from the High Court and the shipping ministry, Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) allegedly leased out vast tracts of shores and foreshores of different rivers around the capital in the last three years.

BIWTA Chairman Samsuddoha Khondaker allegedly made these deals in an underhand way after assuming office in

October 2011, according to a set of allegations the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) is looking into.

The HC in a verdict in June 2009 asked the government to protect all rivers in the country from land grabbers. Three months later, the shipping ministry decided to cancel the leases and not to lease out shores and foreshores any more.
