2 more killed in 2 dists; latest spate of violence takes 20 lives in 10 days: around a week ago. He had :

Five people, including a child, were burnt to death as alleged blockaders hurled a petrol bomb in a long-haul bus at Jaigirhat in Rangpur early yesterday.

At least 15 others were injured, one of them critically. Of the 15, six suffered burns. All but one of the injured were being treated at Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

The incident took place although the bus, along with some 30 more, was plying under law enforcement agencies' protection.

The attack was made on Rangpur-Dhaka highway on the ninth day of the BNP-led alliance's countrywide nonstop blockade that claimed two more lives in Chittagong and Feni, raising the death toll to 20 since January 5. Yesterday's SEE PAGE 2 COL 4
