Weighing in at 220 lbs and measur ing six feet wide, the boat was made from 305 feet of paper, 492 feet of sticky tape and two gallons of glue to keep it waterproof.

Engineers selected paper that is stronger and more water-resistant than usual, because the boat was to be in

the water for much longer than a normal small-scale version. They also made modifications to the traditional design.

To ensure it didn't capsize, a keel of wood was added underneath the boat, while a polystyrene block supporting the pyramid of paper was added for safety.

Ridged paper in the base of the boat created a platform strong enough for someone to stand on.

The craft stayed in the water for two hours and is still intact, despite having a soggy bottom -- but no one is sure exactly how long it could survive. It is said to have 'handled like a dream'.

empty container at the port and later it would be shifted to the Health Physics and Radioactive Waste Management Unit of BAEC at Savar for permanent storage.

Md Mofazzal Haider, head of Radiation Control Unit of Bangladesh Atomic Energy Regulatory Authority, said such type of radioactive substance was found for the first time in Bangladesh.

Masud Kamal said they were yet to know the name of the item's manufacturer but there was a serial number on it.

He suspected that the substance was mixed with the scrapped steel materials of the container accidentally.

Mabia Steel of Sitakunda in April last year exported the container packed with 19 tonnes of steel for India via Colombo Port. On April 29, the Colombo Port authorities detected radiation from the container and sent

it back to Chittagong.

Md Didarul Alam, proprietor of Mabia Steel, a scrapped steel exporter, said they had collected the items mainly from industrial units in Dhaka. He blamed a pre-shipment inspec-

tion firm Superintendent Company of

India, nominated by the importer, for giving no objection certificate after examining the goods. Assistant Commission of

Chittagong Customs House Ahmedur Reza Chowdhury said the container entered the port through the gate number- 4 which does not have any Radiation Portal Monitor for detecting radioactive substances.

Currently, three out of 11 gates of the port have RPM provided by the US Department of Energy.

The US department also sent a ninemember experts' team to Bangladesh for the recovery of the radioactive substance from the container.
