# Devotees join Ijtema defying blockade

Second phase begins on Turag bank

The second phase of Biswa Ijtema, the largest Muslim congregation after the hajj, began on the bank of Turag river at Tongi yesterday amid the ongoing BNP-led 20-party alliance blockade.


The three-day second phase of the Ijtema began after the Fazr prayers with religious sermons delivered by Maulana Ismail Hossain of India.

Despite the opposition programme, the Ijtema venue and its adjacent areas literally turned into a human sea by the time of Juma prayers led by Qwari Zobayer Hossain, imam of Kakrail mosque.

During the prayers, thousands of Muslims were seen on the streets blocking vehicular movement and roofs of different houses and markets in the area.

Millions of devotees, including foreigners, had started to throng the venue in Gazipur since Wednesday night.

Obama, Cameron in anti-terror push

Vow new cooperation on combating cyber attacks

Britain and the US are to share expertise on preventing radicalism and tackling domestic "violent extremism".

Prime Minister David Cameron announced the move following talks with President Barack Obama at the White House, warning that they both faced a "poisonous and fanatical ideology".

The taskforce will report back to the two leaders within six months.

Cameron also said Britain would deploy more unarmed drones to help ground forces tackle Islamic State.

The prime minister is on a two-day visit to Washington for talks with President Obama, likely to be his final Washington visit before the UK general election in May.

Obama promised to "do everything in our power" to assist France in their effort to combat terrorism in the wake of the attacks that killed at least 17 people across the SEE PAGE 11 COL 5

## BCL leader's tendons cut off in Sylhet

Miscreants cut the tendons of both the legs of a local Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leader in the city yesterday.

The victim was identified as Ponki, a leader of Shahparan thana unit of BCL.

Witnesses said a group of miscreants in several motorcycles swooped on Ponki at Shahparan Gate around 6:00pm and stabbed him indiscriminately while he was gossiping with some of his friends.

At one stage, the attackers severed the tendons of his two legs and fled the scene. Ponki was rushed to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital.
