Korea stun Socceroos



Lee Jeong-Hyeop struck in the first half as South Korea shocked Australia 1-0 on Saturday to top Group A and complicate the hosts' task at the Asian Cup.

Australia had been the form team with two big wins so far, but Ange Postecoglou's rejigged side were dealt a setback after the Korean striker slid in to score on 32 minutes.

The Socceroos, who finish second in Group A, will now play China in the quarterfinals in hot and humid Brisbane and face a likely semifinal against holders Japan.

Australia threw everything at South Korea as they sought a vital equaliser, and Kim Jin-Hyeon saved brilliantly from Robbie Kruse when the substitute looked certain to score. The game was not without controversy, with Park Joo-Ho

and Koo Ja-Cheol both stretchered off and Matthew Spiranovic earning a caution that rules him out of their lasteight tie. "I definitely feel that we could have got a draw out of the

game," said talismanic forward Tim Cahill, who came on in the second half but this time was unable to rescue Australia. "Korea took their chance, full credit to them. But I definitely feel like we could have finished top of the group."

With clouds of moths swarming around Brisbane Stadium, Kwak Tae-Hwi nodded wide and Tomi Juric's fierce shot was saved at the near post as the teams exchanged early chances.

Nathan Burns clattered Park, who was stretchered off and later withdrew, in an aerial challenge, before South Korea found a way through in the 32nd minute.

Captain Ki Sung-Yueng threaded the ball to Lee Keun-Ho, whose cross-shot to the far post was met by the sliding Lee Jeong-Hyeop with Aussie goalkeeper Mat Ryan given no chance.

Endo reaches landmark



Japan's Yasuhito Endo reacted with mock horror after learning he had tied German superstar Lothar Matthaeus by winning his 150th cap in his country's 1-0 Asian Cup vic-ASIAN CUP tory over Iraq.

The 34-year-old midfielder, given his international debut by Brazilian Zico in 2002, is expected to surpass Matthaeus, who skippered West Germany to World Cup glory in 1990, when the Blue Samurai play Jordan in their final Group D game on Tuesday.

"Me going level with Matthaeus is a bit of an insult to Matthaeus," said Japan's record caps holder, initially discarded by Japan coach Javier Aguirre following their flop at last year's World Cup before forcing his way back into the Mexican's reckoning.

"But winning so many caps is obviously something I can be proud of, and matching Matthaeus is another thing I can look back on and boast about when I'm no longer playing.

"I remember my first international appearance and my first goal for my country. But I don't want to look back and single out any one game," added the J-League player of the year after becoming the 16th player in FIFA records to reach the 150-cap milestone.

"I mean, I don't think I'm finished yet," said Endo, dubbed Japan's "mole in the hole" by former Gamba Osaka manager Akira Nishino for his ability to pop up in space.

"I plan to prolong my international career as long as I can," added Endo, who scored in the 4-0 thrashing of Palestine in Japan's opening game at the Asian Cup last Monday and turns 35 three days before the tournament final in Sydney on January 31.

"Endo is a wonderful human being," said Aguirre, who brought him back into the international fold after a poor run of form since taking over from Alberto Zaccheroni post-Brazil. "He is a big presence for this team."

Endo, who shuns the limelight in a Japan team dominated by spiky cult hero Keisuke Honda and the mercurial Shinji Kagawa, insisted he still had a role to play for the defending Asian Cup champions.

"I think I can still improve and believe there's more to experience," said Endo, who helped Gamba to a domestic treble this year. "I want to enjoy my football and keep setting records."

Second title for Troicki

Viktor Troicki won the battle of the qualifiers to claim his second career title with a straight sets win over Mikhail Kukushkin in the final of the Sydney International on Saturday.

Troicki crushed Kukushkin 6-2, 6-3 in a victory that will send the Serb moving up the world rankings.

The one-time world No.12, who won his first title in Moscow five years ago, spiralled to 847th before his return from suspension last July, but is expected to be back in the top 70 on Monday from his current 92.

"A lot of emotions. It's been a tough road, a lot of work, and it paid off with a nice title," Troicki said.

"If I look back where I was five, six months ago it's amazing to have a title already. So it's really nice moment for me and for all my team. It's very emotional."

Troicki, 28, was forced to serve a 12-month ban for failing to take a blood test at the Monte Carlo Masters in 2013, and is eager to make up for lost time.

"When I got back, I looked on this like a second chance, second career actually," Troicki said. "It's been a nice come-

back. It's been different playing tennis ever since I came back. I'm more happy on the court."
