

Hafizur Rahman Rajib, 23, a talented stage actor, died of kidney failure at a private hospital in Mymensingh on

He was laid to rest at Golkibari graveyard after namaz-e-janaza at Naumohol Primary School ground on Friday.

Govinda Halder passed away on Saturday after battling oldage health complications, but left behind a legacy of songs he wrote - "Mora Ekti Phool ke Bachabo Bole Juddho Kori", "Purbo Digonte Surjo Uthechhe Rokto Lal" and "Ek Sagor Rokter Binimoye", that inspired a nation in its struggle for freedom. him as a lyricist. May his soul rest in peace, and may the Almighty give his family the strength to overcome this loss.


Khairul Anam Shakil, singer I had the privilege of meeting him a couple
