Many flee after joint force drive

Fearing arrest, most of the males in two villages of Shibganj upazila are staying away from home at night after members of the joint forces allegedly ransacked and torched houses during raids there on Thursday.

In the two villages, Rasulpur and Mohadipur, most people are said to be supporters of the BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami.

Locals alleged that the members of police, Rab and BGB vandalised 35 houses, torched two more and at least seven motorcycles during Thursday's drives. Four to five masked men were with the joint forces during the rampage in Rasulpur.

This correspondent visited the villages yesterday and saw broken televisions, furniture and ceramic products strewn across the floors of many houses.

Villagers said they had already moved their valuables to other "safe" places, fearing

further "attacks" by the law enforcers. Police refute the allegations. They say the

Kaptai fear returns

74 families get eviction notice to make way for Rangamati Science & Technology University

The Vihar is for people. It's the community members who bear almost all the expenses of the temple. If they cannot live in the village, how will be the Vihar run?

Gyanajyoti Chakma, chief of Gautama Memorial Bouddha Vihar in Bilaichhari Para, looked worried while talking to this correspondent.

The government has decided to build Rangamati Science & Technology University acquiring around 100 acres of land in Bilaichhari Para and its neighbouring hydropower project. Mitingachhari village.

Though the land of the Vihar has not been included in the government acquisition list, 74 families got eviction notice from the administration.

"I am not sure what would happen to

them and where would they go," said Gyanajyoti who took the charge of the Vihar since it was established in 2004.

Rahul Chakma, who donated a portion of his land adjacent to their house to build the Vihar, is among those served the eviction notice. "We first migrated when our village

[Manikchhari Para] was inundated due to Kaptai dam in 1960. Now we were being asked to move again," said Rahul Chakma. Most of the villagers are like Rahul,

descendants of victims of Kaptai Basuki Chakma, karbari (chief) of the village, is among a few elderly people who

still can remember what happened after the construction of the Kaptai dam.

De Villiers hits fastest 100, 50

AB de Villiers took 31 balls to smash the fastest century in one-day internationals on Sunday as South Africa posted 439 for two wickets, their highest team total in this format, against the West Indies at the Wanderers.

Described by retired Australia wicketkeeper Adam Gilchrist as the "most valuable cricketer on the planet" earlier this week, de Villiers blasted 16 sixes and nine fours in his blistering 44-ball knock of 149, bettering New Zealander Corey Anderson's 36-ball century against West Indies last year.

Voters to get smart NID cards in March

The Election Commission is going to start distribution of smart National Identity (NID) cards among voters on March 26 as it expects to begin the card generation process within a month.

Around nine crore voters of the country would get smart NID cards free of cost, said EC Secretary Sirazul Islam.

The commission had recently singed an agreement with French company Oberthur Technologies for producing the smart cards, he told reporters at a press briefing at the EC media centre in the capital yesterday.

The EC will spend Tk 800 crore to generate 90 million smart cards under its Identification System for Enhancing Access to Services (IDEA) project.

Detailed information of a voter with pho-

tograph would be included in the new cards and 25 types of security features would be ensured to prevent possible forgery.

These cards might be used in getting services like taxpayers identification number (TIN), driving license, passport, banking, trade license, marriage registration, health cards, utility services and admission in education institutions.

The existing laminated NID cards are printed on papers and can be easily forged. The law enforcers have so far arrested several people in connection with doctoring the NID cards.

"We hope to start issuing the cards on the upcoming Independence Day. We will issue at least a token number of smart cards in case we cannot prepare the cards," the secretary said.

PALESTINE WAR CRIMES PROBE

Israel now lobbying against ICC funding

Israel is lobbying member-states of the International Criminal Court (ICC) to cut funding for the tribunal in response to its launch of an inquiry into possible war crimes in the Palestinian territories, officials said yesterday. ICC prosecutors said on Friday they

would examine "in full independence and

impartiality" crimes that may have occurred

since June 13 last year. This allows the court

to delve into the war between Israel and Hamas militants in Gaza in July-August 2014 that killed more than 2,100 Palestinians and 70 Israelis.

The decision came after Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas, in the absence of peace talks and against strong opposition from Israel and the United States, requested ICC membership, which comes into effect on April 1.
