



Chobi Mela is here, and there is plenty to be excited about. Photographers, visual artists and enthusiasts alike have two weeks of overdrive to go into, discovering the cultural diversity and shifting global trends in photography, on the theme "Intimacy". With 31 participating artists from 22 countries, there's a great mix of authoritative figures, rising photographers and niche artists, working on subject matters very hard-hitting amusing ones and selfreflective works. And then there are workshops, artist talks and lectures taking the audience beyond the camera. While every individual will be driven by

their own choice of artists and subjects, here are a few of the most exciting happenings to check out during the festival, as a glimpse of what to expect at large from it. Renowned Canadian poet and folk

musician Larry Towell has a compelling exhibition titled "The Mennonites", a group of Protestant religious sect, related to the Amish. 
New windows for children filmmakers
