

Anti-violence campaigners frustrated

The country is heading towards a bleak future with no silver lining in sight as the confronting political parties are taking no step to reach consensus.

Even if it is only for the sake of saving innocent human lives, the confronting parties should sit and discuss the issues in question.

The views came from members of groups and organisations which formed human chains and organised rallies and signature campaigns in front of Jatiya Press Club in the capital yesterday.

Peshajibi Shamannoy Parishad, a platform of professionals, demanded that BNP-Jamaat-e-Islami leaders compensate people falling victim to violence centring the ongoing blockade being enforced since January 6.

"The violence is taking place to enforce the blockade called by the BNP chairperson. So leaders related with the blockade programme should be held accountable for the deaths and violence," said the parishad Secretary General Kamrul Hasan.

Urging the government to strengthen law enforcement, he said a memorandum would be submitted to the state minister for home today.

Bangladesh College-Biswabidyalay Shikshak Samity, a platform of college and university teachers, formed a human chain where Awami League Publicity Secretary Hasan Mahmud said Khaleda must shun the path of violence.

"She should understand the agony of losing a child after her son's death," he said.

At another human chain the Federation of Bangladesh Human Rights Organisations formed, the participants said a fruitful dialogue between the quarrelling political camps was the only hope for the general public.

"The current impasse is the result of a political crisis. The president can take an initiative to mediate a dialogue between the large political parties," said its Convener Md Shajahan.

She was buried at the Shewrapara graveyard yesterday evening.

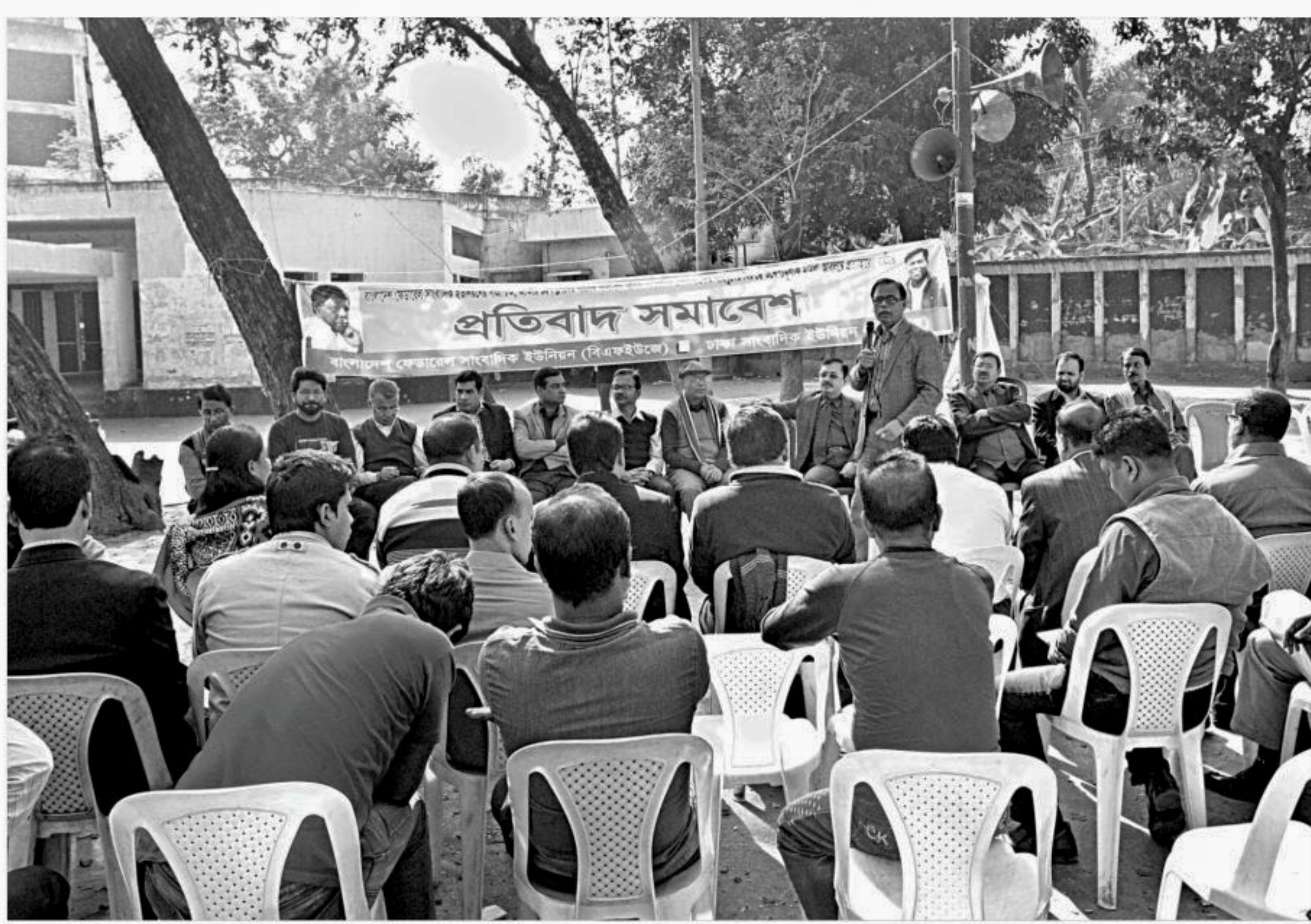
Qulkhwani

GDP to see 2pc drop by 2050 for climate change

Says Manju

Bangladesh would face losses equivalent to two percent of the GDP by 2050 due to the climate change fallout, Environment and Forest Minister Anwar Hossain Manju told parliament yesterday, citing a study of the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

He said if proper steps were not taken, the losses would jump to 9.4 percent by 2100.

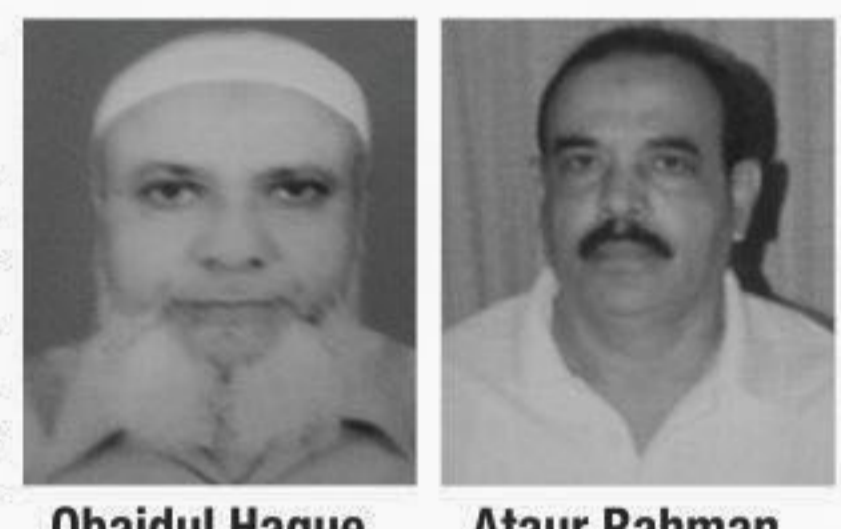
Referring to the Bangladesh Climate Change Strategy and Action Plan (BCCSAP) that the government formulated in 2009 to deal with the impacts, he said already Tk 2,900 crore had been provided under the initiative, while development partners had committed \$187 million.

Two NETRAKONA 'RAZAKARS' ICT to decide on indictment Feb 15

International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday fixed February 15 to state whether alleged Razakars of Netrakona Obaidul Haque alias Taher and Ataur Rahman alias Noni will be charged with war crimes.

The three-member tribunal, led by Justice M Enayetullah Rahim with members Justice Jahangir Hossain Selim and Justice Anwarul Haque, has been hearing arguments after taking the charges into cognisance on December 11, 2014.

Defence counsel Shah Mohammad Shahab-Uddin claimed the charges were "unrealistic".

"From our experience we know that people ran away wherever the Pakistani (occupation) army went...So, it is not true that they (instead of running away) accompanied the Pakistani army."

"Besides, there is no eyewitness. All are hearsay witnesses," he said.

Prosecutor Mokhlesur Rahman Badal said there was enough evidence. "We will be able to prove it in the trial stage," he said.

The formal charges say the duo were involved in the abduction and killing of at least 15 persons and looting and arson attack on over 400-450 houses during the 1971 Liberation War.

The duo led Razakars, an auxiliary force of the Pakistani occupation army, in the abduction of one Fazlur Rahman Talukder from Baushi Bazar under Barhatta Police Station on August 17, 1971. He was later killed at Trimohoni Bazar, it reads.

The duo abducted acclaimed footballer Dabir Hossain from Barhatta on October 4, 1971 and shot him dead at Moktarpara Bridge after torture, it adds.

They abducted 10 persons from Barhatta on October 12, 1971, seven of whom were shot dead. On November 15, 1971, they abducted another six, including a Liberation War organiser Badiuzzaman Mukto, and shot them dead, say the charges.

Road crashes kill 5, injure 6

Five people died and six people were injured in road accidents in the country yesterday.

In Chittagong, Kabir Hossain, 40, a sergeant of Fouzderhat Highway Police Outpost died and four others were injured as a police patrol van hit a covered-van on Dhaka-Chittagong highway in Sitakunda upazila.

In Habiganj -- Safique Miah, 40, and Masuk Miah, 25, of Simulghar village died, and two others were injured when a CNG-run auto-rickshaw hit a pickupvan on Dhaka-Sylhet highway in Madhabpur upazila.

In Lalmonirhat, Nazrul Islam, 48, of Nawdabash village died when a truck hit his bicycle on Chaparhat-Chandrapur road under Kalganj upazila.

In Panchagarh, Abdul Quader, 35, of Kaleshwar village died when a tractor rammed into his motorcycle in Amlahar village under Panchagarh Sadar.

although the university had no campus or building. The government is yet to ensure the rights of indigenous people living in the CHT and effectively implement the peace accord which was signed in 1997, it said.

Although an untoward situation arose following the opening of a medical college in Rangamati this year, the government intends to open the university despite protests of indigenous leaders and PCP, it read.

So it was clear that the government was doing so not to expand the opportunity of higher education but as part of a "conspiracy" against the indigenous people in the name of development, they said.

The PCP also urged students and parents not to be a part of the "conspiracy" by seeking admission at the university.
