Arson claims 2 more lives

There is no respite yet for innocent people from the ongoing countrywide blockade as the violent political programme continues to wreak havoc on public life and livelihood, national economy and education.

Two more burn victims died yesterday after suffering from excruciating pain, raising the death toll to 33 in the political violence that started on January 5.

One of the victims was a trucker from Sylhet and another a truck helper from Rangpur.

Another trucker and his helper suffered burns at Sitakunda in Chittagong yesterday, the 22nd day of the nonstop blockade enforced by the BNP-led 20party alliance.

The BNP-led combine has meanwhile called a 36hour hartal in Sylhet division and Shibir and BNP called a 36-hour hartal in

New Loan Restructuring Policy

Big borrowers to get 12 years to repay

Taking the facility, borrower cannot pay cash dividend to shareholders in first 3 years

The central bank yesterday approved a restructuring policy under which a big borrower would get a maximum of 12 years to repay loans above Tk 500 crore.

The borrower will not be allowed to provide any cash dividend to shareholders in the first three years after taking the restructuring facility. Even after that period, he has to take permission from the bank to give dividend, says the policy.

For restructuring a lone, a bank has to set aside from its own income an amount equivalent to 2 percent of the loan.

A big borrower can get the facility only once but has to apply for it by June 30 this year, according to the policy.

Bangladesh Bank will soon issue a circular to this

Emerging from a BB board meeting, Deputy Governor SK Sur Chowdhury told reporters that the policy is aimed at giving support to clients who couldn't repay loans timely due to unavoidable reasons like political unrest, and local and international factors.

It would boost economic activities and ensure repayment of loans, he said.


Speedy power supply act gets 4-year extension

New York shuts down for blizzard Speaking to CNN, New York City Mayor

New York City's mayor has responded to claims that officials overreacted to the threat posed by Winter Storm Juno, saying: "We dodged a bullet."

As New York awoke to a blanket of snow less deep than feared, forecasts were downgraded and a transport ban was lifted in the

But up to 60cm (24in) was still expected Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts and New Hampshire.

Some 60 million people may be affected.

Bill de Blasio said: "This is a better-safethan-sorry scenario."

He added: "We did what was necessary to keep everyone safe."

Blizzard warnings have now been lifted in New York City and New Jersey, and New York Governor Andrew Cuomo said yesterday that the driving ban had been lifted in New York City.

On Monday an emergency was declared in places across New York state, in a swathe of north-eastern states, and meteorologists predicted up to 90cm (36in) of snow. Officials later revised the SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

A Jhalakathi court yesterday granted permanent bail in a case filed against Bangla daily Prothom Alo Editor Matiur Rahman.

The accused appeared in the court of Senior Judicial Magistrate Md Arifuzzaman in the morning and prayed for bail in the case filed on charge of hurting religious sentiments of the Muslims and the Hindus.

After hearing, the court granted the prayer, and also exempted Matiur Rahman from personal appearance in the court in the case, said Manik Acharya, lawyer of the defendant. The court fixed the next

date of hearing on February 22, he added.

Advocate Bani Amin Baklai filed the case with the Jhalakathi court against Matiur Rahman, editor of the Prothom Alo, and Md Majid Ali, photojournalist of the same daily, on April 9 in 2014, said Akkas Shikder, another lawyer of Matiur Rahman. In this regard, Baklai
