PM criticises SC verdict

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in parliament yesterday criticised a Supreme Court verdict on Warrant of Precedence.

On January 6, the Appellate Division of the SC disposed of "with expunction, modification, observation and findings" a government appeal against a 2010 High Court order that declared illegal and void the existing Warrant of Precedence, formulated in 1986 and revised in 2008. But the full text of the

order is yet to be released. On January 7, newspapers quoting SC lawyer M Asaduzzaman reported the apex court ruled that the status of the chief justice the Speaker in the Warrant

Suffering, silently

Violence gnaws at children's psychology

Rubaiya shivers with fear whenever she

hears a loud sound. The third grader of a private school in

Dhaka was on her way back home with her father on a rickshaw just a week ago. As they reached near Abahani playground on Sat Masjid Road, they heard a large bang and saw people running helter-skelter.

Her father promptly took her to a nearby shop when Rubaiya began to cry out of panic.

"Whenever she hears a bang now she asks, 'What happened baba? Is it bombing again?'," her father Shimul said.

He added panic would grip even the adults if they witnessed such incidents, whereas his daughter was just a minor kid.

"Now if gory images of burn victims or grow up with fear, their confidence level political violence are shown on TV, I instantly change the channel so that she does not get scared again," he said.

Scores of children like Rubaiya are suffering from extreme anxiety and panic amid a

spate of political violence that killed at least 33 people, burned nearly 350 and left thousands injured.

However, publication and projection of the images of blood, explosion and arson are on the rise in the media, causing psychological damage to children, a fact that remains ignored.

Psychiatrists say frequent exposure to images of violence can lead children to developing anxiety and unwarranted fear, particularly when they are outdoors.

"Any violence or its pictorial exposure

has huge negative impacts on people, especially children," said Prof Dr Azizur Rahman of psychology department at Dhaka University. They become disrespectful to the society

remains low and they cannot trust others, Prof Rahman told The Daily Star. All these impede mental development and some may have psychological disorder

equivalent exams as per schedule. "The exams will be held on schedule...," Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid told reporters after a meeting with law enforce-


ment agencies at the secretariat yesterday. Nahid discussed the current law and order situation and other issues relating to the exam at the

Delete 'secular', 'socialist' from Indian charter

A day after row erupted over a Republic Day advertisement of Indian Information and Broadcasting Ministry, the Shiv Sena yesterday demanded "permanent deletion" of the words 'secular' and 'socialist' from the Constitution.

An acrimonious war of words had broken out between political parties yesterday when an advertisement issued by the I&B Ministry carried a picture of the Preamble to the Constitution as it appeared before the 42nd Amendment, without the words 'secular' and 'social-

"We welcome the exclusion of the (secular and socialist) words from the Republic Day advertisement. Though it might have been done inadvertently, it is like honouring the feelings of the people of India. If these words were deleted by mistake this time, they should be deleted from the

Burdwan Blast

4 more JMB operatives held in India

India's National Investigation Agency yesterday arrested four more alleged members and recruiters of outlawed Jama'at-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB), which is linked to the October 2 Burdwan blast.

The four -- Dalim Sheikh alias Faijul Hoque Sheikh, Motiur Rehman alias Noor Alam, Habibur Rehman and Ghiyasuddin Munshi -- were arrested in different areas of West Bengal and have been put on remand by a Kolkata court.

With the latest arrests, the NIA has so far held 16 people including suspected mastermind Sajid, who is a Bangladeshi citizen, in connection with the blast. The NIA took over the case from West Bengal police in

October after international links started surfacing behind the mysterious blast inside a house on October 2 last year that left one dead and another seriously wounded. The NIA said they had learned that improvised explosive

devices were being manufactured at that house and smuggled to neighbouring Bangladesh. Giving details about yesterday's arrest, the NIA in a statement said Dalim Sheikh was a "full-time member" of IMB and was involved in setting up bases and hideouts, raising

and collecting funds, radicalising youths and providing

tactical and material support to their senior Bangladeshi

members of JMB in spreading their network in India. SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

Tribunal-1 on December 30 last year handed the Jamaat leader death penalty on three out of six charges of crimes against humanity committed during the 1971 Liberation War.


