Yesterday, Education Minister

Nurul Islam Nahid once again urged

the BNP and its allies not to enforce shutdowns on exam days. "Taking pity on the students, they [the BNP] should withdraw or at least suspend their programmes on the

exam days," he told reporters after attending the second convocation of Sylhet Metropolitan University.

Several other ministers also talked about the issue yesterday.

At a programme in Jamalpur, Health Minister Mohammad Nasim said leaders and activists of the Awami League-led 14-party alliance will "guard the exam centres".

The BNP, however, has not shown any sign that it would consider lifting shutdowns on exam days.

Party's Vice Chairman Hafizuddin Ahmed yesterday wondered how exams could be held while abductions and killings are taking place in the country in the absence of the rule of law. The rule of law must be estab-

lished first and then the exams can be held, he said while speaking as a panellist at BBC Bangladesh Sanglap yesterday.

Meanwhile, Inspector General of Police AKM Shahidul Hoque said, "We will take necessary measures to ensure security of the students on the road and at the centres during exam hours."

Briefing reporters at the police headquarters, he said the exams are going to be held at an "unusual Shahidul sought cooperation from

politicians and people in general to make sure that the students can take the exams safely. Asked about the security measures,

he said it's not possible for them to provide security individually. "We will arrange security at macro level. We may escort a group of students at a time in a certain area." PROTEST PROGRAMMES

Students and teachers of capital's Badda Girls High School formed a

human chain near Khaleda Zia's Gulshan office, demanding withdrawal of the opposition's blockade and hartal on exam days. Around 600 students and teachers

stood on both sides of a road near the BNP chief's office for half an hour from 10:30am with placards, "We want to study"; "Don't kill us"; "Don't burn us." Meanwhile, some guardians of

students at Motijheel Model School submitted a memorandum to Khaleda, calling for withdrawal of the ongoing hartal and blockade.

Syeda Shamima Sultana and Irin Luna Akhter, who signed the memo on the guardians' behalf, told reporters that they wanted security of their school-going children.

The guardians would visit the Prime Minister's Office today to hand in a memorandum with the same demand.

In the meantime, students, teachers and guardians held demonstrations in a number of districts, including Jamalpur, Mymensingh, Khulna, Sherpur, Satkhira, Kishoreganj, Chittagong, Pabna and Rajshahi.

Saiful Islam Selim, 35, and Nawshad Ali, 19, in Rajshahi; Ekramul Huq Sumon, 23, in Chittagong; and Mohammad Ali, 25 in Sirajganj.

Saiful and Nawshad were arrested from in front of Lokhnath High School in the city when a group of masked Shibir men were fleeing having thrown a crude bomb at police, said Ifte Khair Alam, an assistant commissioner of Rajshahi Metropolitan Police.

Ekramul was arrested from near the Didar Market area of Chandanpura in the port city. As police, upon secret information, chased a large group of Shibir activists who allegedly were planning subversive activities, the group hurled two crude bombs at police. Ekramul was caught on the spot but others managed to flee the scene, said Mohiuddin Selim, officer-incharge of Kotwali Police Station.

Police later raided the Darul Ulum Aliya Madrasha as most of the attackers ran inside it and picked up 34 more people. They also seized explosive materials weighing around 2 kgs, he added.

Mohammad Ali, 25, a staunch Shibir activist who is accused in many other cases, was arrested as he, disguised as a passenger, attempted to set ablaze an auto rickshaw at Kanshona Ghoshpara on the Ullapara-Belkuchi road around 2:30pm. He was stalled and caught by a mob who then beat him up and handed him over to police, said Md Ataur Rahman, officer-incharge of Ullapara Police Station.

to police two Shibir activists after they

were caught trying to attack a vehicle at Kashipur Bilbabari in Barisal city.

On January 24, locals caught and beat up a Shibir leader and his two associates when they were attempting to hurl petrol bombs on a passenger bus on the Dhaka-Narayangani road. They later handed them over to police.

Shihabuddin Shihab, general secretary of Fatullah Shibir unit, later confessed before a Narayanganj court his involvement in the incident.

On January 23, an angry mob beat up two Shibir cadres in Rajshahi's Poba upazila after they torched a passenger bus. Later they were handed over to police.

On January 21, police arrested the Shibir president of Keshabpur upazila in Jessore with a petrol bomb and some explosive materials. On the same day, law enforcers

arrested five leaders and activists of Shibir and seized 130 crude bombs, two litres of petrol, one kg of gunpowder and other bomb-making materials from a building in the capital.

"It was a bomb factory. The Shibir men used to supply bombs across the capital from there," a police official said on that day.

Throughout 2013, Shibir hogged the headlines for beating up policemen, torching public vehicles and properties and killing people, exploding bombs, felling trees on roads and uprooting railway tracks.

Their violent activities were reflected in the IHS Jane's Global Terrorism & Insurgency Attack Index 2013 which said Shibir was the third On January 28, locals handed over most active non-state armed group in

therapy to grow a womb, ovaries, and fallopian tubes inside Hayley Haynes, who is from North London. Ms Haynes, who is now 28, discov-

ered her condition at age 19 after consulting doctors when she did not get any periods despite going through other signs of puberty. Doctors told her she had been

born with XY chromosomes, which made her genetically male. Haynes told the Daily Mirror

newspaper: "When they told me I had no womb I was so confused I felt sick. My biggest fear was never having children. "Suddenly a huge piece of my life was missing. I felt like half a woman

and was embarrassed. How I was

going to tell a guy I was genetically

male when I started dating?" Scans of her body in 2007 revealed that she had a womb measuring millimetres in size inside her, which doctors treated with hormones to enlarge.

After years of treatment she began IVF, which she had to pay for privately at a clinic in Cyprus after the NHS refused to fund her course. The treatment cost £10,500.

Mrs Haynes explained to the newspaper: "I was so nervous. We only had one shot and couldn't afford to go through it all again. I desperately wanted to be a mother and knew if there were no viable eggs or the implantation wasn't successful I'd be distraught. "Of the 13 eggs harvested only two

were viable. After they were implanted I spent the rest of our 10 days resting."

Ultimately both eggs took and she was told she was due to give birth to non-identical twins. She named the two girls Darcey and Avery. Ms Haynes said she and her hus-

band Sam had "empty wallets" and were "emotionally exhausted" but that they would "do it again in a heartbeat". Dr Geetha Venkat, of Harley Street

Fertility Clinic, London, described the case as "amazing". The news comes as the regulator

On December 4 last year, the DMCH doctors declared a female patient dead. However, she stirred to life on the way to the morgue three hours later. The woman, about 45, whose identity could not be known, died a day later at the hospital.

The boy was naturally born premature on Friday night and stopped breathing around 8:45 in the morning. When doctors were called in, they declared the infant dead without even checking him properly, the family alleged.

Around three hours later at Azimpur Graveyard in the capital, the boy's uncle Mahmudul Karim was holding the baby wrapped in a towel while father Jahangir Alam was preparing to bathe his son. Suddenly, Mahmudul felt his newborn nephew moving.
