

Info service man held with fake notes, documents

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested a contractual employee of Ghatail upazila information service Centre on charge of printing fake currency notes there yesterday.

The arrestee, Mohammad Abdul Aziz, 34, hailing from Niamatpur village in the upazila, has been working as an udyogkta, giving contractual service at the centre for the last one year.

Acting on a tip, a team of Crime Prevention Company-3 of Rab-12 raided the upazila information service centre and arrested Aziz red-handed when he was printing fake notes there, said Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Mohiuddin Faruki, commander of the unit.

"The law enforcers also seized 31 fake notes of Tk 500, fake note making papers, two fake certificates of National University, certificate making papers, a laptop, a colour printer and other materials used to make fake notes and documents from the office.

"The arrestee, a member of an organised fake note making ring, admitted that he has been printing fake notes to meet the demand of some cattle traders and cheating people by supply-

ing the fake notes to markets for long," the ASP added.

The arrestee was handed over to Ghatail Police Station after filing a case in this regard.

Arrested Aziz told this correspondent that he earlier started printing fake notes out of curiosity when he was an employee of a computer business centre in Dhaka.

Housewife murdered for dowry

A housewife was killed by her husband for dowry at Sarapole village in Sharsha upazila of the district on Sunday night.

The victim was identified as Chand Banu, 37, wife of Zinnath Ali of the village.

Zinnath married Chand Banu, daughter of Jamal Uddin of Islampur Village in Jhikargachha upazila 18 years ago.

He had been putting pressure on Jamal Uddin for the last six months to give him Tk one lakh and two bighas of land as dowry.

On Sunday night, Zinnath locked in an altercation with Chand Banu over the issue and at one stage, he strangled her.

Sajeda Bagum, mother of Chand Banu, claimed that her daughter was strangled by her in-laws.

Being informed by locals, police went to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to Jessore Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Jamal Uddin filed a case with Sharsha Police Station yesterday, accusing Zinnath of killing his daughter. Zinnath had gone into hiding soon after filing of the case, police said.

Schoolteacher stabbed in Feni

Criminals stabbed a schoolteacher in Sonagazi upazila of the district on Sunday night.

The victim, Golam Faruk, 40, son of Abdul Khaleq, was admitted to Sonagazi Upazila Health Complex.

Police quoted locals as saying that a gang of unknown criminals waylaid Faruk, a teacher of Bakultala Government Primary School, while he was returning home at Bakultala village from a local market, riding a motorbike at around 10:00pm.

They stabbed Faruk with sharp weapons, leaving him critically injured.

Hearing screams, locals rushed to the spot, rescued Faruk and took him to the hospital. None of the gang members was arrested as of filing of this report at 3:00pm yesterday.

Nabir Hossain, officer in-charge of Sonagazi Police Station, said they are trying to arrest the culprits involved.

AL infighting leaves 15 injured in Shailakupa

A clash between two groups of Awami League (AL) men left 15 people injured at Bardah village in Shailakupa upazila under the district yesterday.

A villager named Abdur Rashid, 45, who was witnessing the fatal clash, died of a cardiac arrest during the incident, said Madhury Karmakar, on-duty doctor of Jhenidah Sadar Hospital.

At around 12:30pm, the

two groups -- one led by former union parishad (UP) member and ward AL president Nazrul Islam and another led by present UP member and ward AL vice president Anwar Hossain locked in a clash at Bardah village, locals and police said.

Following a brawl over 'bad comments' about the past UP election, they attacked the opponents with spears, billhooks, iron rods and sticks, leaving 15 people injured.

A few of them were admitted to different clinics

while others received treatment from village quacks.

They did not go to any government health complex or hospital in fear of arrest, locals said.

"Police shot 50 rounds of bullets and two teargas shells to disperse the mob and arrested 12 people including UP member Anwar Hossain. The clash occurred as a sequel to a longstanding conflict between the two local AL leaders over establishing supremacy there," said MA Hashem Ali, officer in charge of Shailakupa Police Station.

Books not spared

At least 69 people have been killed in violence and arson since January 5 when the alliance announced the blockade demanding a mid-term election under a non-party administration. Of the dead, 53 had no links to politics.

Meanwhile, BNP in a statement said the opposition's ongoing "peaceful movement" will continue until "the anti-people government" stepped down.

"Sheikh Hasina's dream to stay in power forcibly will be shattered soon following the mass movement in the country," said BNP Joint Secretary General Salahuddin Ahmed.

BOOKS SET ABLAZE

Farid Hossain, manager of Shuktara Transport Agency, said 37,808 books were loaded onto the truck from a printing press in Dhaka. It left for Laxmipur around 4:00am. The books were to be distributed among students in Roypur, Ramgati and Kamalnagar upazilas for free.

When the truck reached near Jamaldi Bus Stop in Gazaria upazila around 5:30am, a petrol bomb was hurled at it, but the bomb did not blast. A second bomb was thrown at the vehicle, putting it on fire, added Farid.

Driver Harun-or-Rashid and his helper were injured after they jumped from the truck.

The trucker said some 10 percent books were burned, but almost all of the rest were damaged when firefighters doused the flames with water.

An official at National Curriculum and Textbook Board said printers were supposed to supply all the pre-primary level books to the upazilas within January 16, but several of them missed the deadline due to the ongoing blockade.

The opposition's unceasing anti-govt agitation has already pushed students,

parents and teachers into a tight corner. Academic activities in educational institutions have been hit hard by the blockade. Experts said it would take a long time to recover the losses.

ARSON VICTIM DIES

Brig Gen AKM Nasir Uddin, director of RMCH, said deceased truck helper Shahidul had badly burned his lungs in the arson attack. He passed away around 5:00pm.

He was injured on the night of February 2 when some masked arsonists threw a petrol bomb at the truck in front of Lili Cinema at Nawdapara. The empty truck was returning to Poba after carrying sand to Rajshahi city.

Victim's wife Manjura Begum said her husband went out for work during the blockade as he had to repay loan instalments on time.

Injured trucker Saidur Rahman has been undergoing treatment at RMCH.

In Mymensingh, a group of alleged blockaders obstructed the Mymensingh-Tangail road at Ramchandrapur around 2:30am by putting logs across.

When the covered van carrying some 5,000 chicks from Gazipur to Kalibari of Muktagachha reached the spot, the arsonists forced the driver to alight from the vehicle; poured petrol on the truck and torched it, said Kamal Hossain, officer-in-charge of Muktagachha Police Station, quoting driver Abdur Rahman.

In Barisal, police arrested a Chhatra Dal activist on the charge of torching a fruit-laden pick-up in Agailghara upazila and awarded the driver Tk 10,000 for saving three lives.

Law enforcers in Gaibandha detained Shibir activist Taskinul Islam Swapan in Gaibandha Sadar upazila. Cops also recovered 22 crude bombs and bomb-making materials from his possession.

Raziur Rahman, OC of Gaibandha Sadar Police Station, said cops picked up the 22-year-old from his shop at Shibpur bazar in the upazila around 5:00pm.

An abandoned crude bomb was recovered at the premises of Azimpur Judges' Quarter in the capital around 8:00pm yesterday, said Labagh police.

Rickshaw-puller Mojammel Haq, 40, was injured when a crude bomb went off in the capital's Katabon.

Law enforcers rounded up 35 BNP-Jamaat men in Satkhira, 11 in Jhenidah, 16 in Mymensingh, 14 in Chittagong and Chhatra Shibir leader Salman Farsi in Hakimpur upazila of Dinajpur.

DU STUDENTS DETAINED Locals beat up two Dhaka University students around 8:30am yesterday for allegedly blasting crude bombs near Jagannath Hall and handed them over to Rab. The Rab later handed them over to Shahbagh police.

Shahadat Nasir Shuvo and Hasanur Rahman are master's students at statistics and Arabic literature departments of the university. The two have been sued under the explosives act, said Sirajul Islam, OC of Shahbagh Police Station.

The DU authorities last night in a press release said they expelled the two students temporarily from the university as per the proctorial rule 5 (2).

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal in a press release claimed that the arrestees are JCD activists. They were picked up from a procession in front of the Central Shaheed Minar. The procession was brought out demanding resignation of DU Vice-chancellor Prof Dr AAMS Arefin Siddique, added the release.

Landslide kills 2 in Habiganj

Two workers were killed in a landslide while cutting a hill in Gulgaon Hill area under Bahubal upazila of Habiganj district yesterday.

The deceased were identified as Abdul Goni, 60, son of Sundar Ali, and Jewel Mia, 15, son of Abdus Shahid, of the area.

Witness said Goni and Jewel died on the spot as a large chunk of earth collapsed on them while they were cutting the hill for collecting clay around 11:00am.

Being informed by locals, police went to the spot, recovered the bodies and sent them to Habiganj Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy, said Ali Farid, officer in-charge of Bahubal Police Station.

Two to die for murder in Netrakona

A Netrakona court yesterday sentenced two people to death for killing a freedom fighter in Mohonganj upazila in 2008.

Those who have been awarded capital punishment are Bakul Mia, 48, of Paboi village, and Anwar Hossain, 27, of Birampur village in the upazila. Both were tried in absentia.

According to the prosecution, Kanu Chandra Talukder, 50, a freedom fighter of North Birampur village, was hacked to death by the duo over previous enmity on May 10, 2008.

Kanchan Chandra Talukder, son of the slain freedom fighter, filed a murder case with the police station concerned the same day, accusing the two.

After examining evidence and witnesses, Additional District and Sessions Judge Abdul Hamid pronounced the verdict.

Two AL leaders murdered in Bogra, Noakhali

Unknown criminals killed two Awami League (AL) leaders in Bogra and Noakhali on Sunday night and early yesterday.

The victims are Shamsul Haque, 50, vice-president of AL Alangi union unit under Dhunat upazila of Bogra; and Md Babul Mia, 52, vice-president of the party's Char Matua union unit under Noakhali Sadar upazila.

Our Bogra correspondent reported that AL leader Shamsul Haque, son of late Mozahar Ali of Rangamati village in Dhunat upazila, went to a local bazaar at around 6:00pm and did not return home at night.

Locals found the body of the AL leader at a paddy field at the village in the morning and informed the police and his family.

Police went to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to Shaheed Zaiur Rahman

Medical College and Hospital (SZMCH) morgue for autopsy.

Contacted, Alangi union AL president MA Tarek Helal, also chairman of the union parishad, said there was a dispute between Shamsul Haque and some locals over the ownership of a land at the village. He demanded proper investigation into the killing.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) Ziaur Rahman of Dhunat Police Station said Shamsul's body bore stab wounds to the throat, chest and abdomen. "We are trying to unearth clue to the murder and arrest the killers," the OC said.

In Noakhali, AL leader Md Babul Mia was hacked to death by an unidentified gang at Khalishatola in Char Matua union early yesterday, reports our correspondent.

Son of Md Habib Ullah of Khalishatola village,

Babul was also a member of Char Matua Union Parishad.

Officer-in-Charge Anwar Hossain of Sudharam Model Police Station quoted locals as saying that Babul came under attack while he was returning home from a bazaar in the area, riding a motorbike at around 12:30am.

The gang intercepted Babul near Swarnaker Bari at the village and hit him with sharp weapons. He died on the spot.

Police recovered the body and sent it to Noakhali Abdul Malek Ukil Medical College Hospital for post-mortem examination.

Advocate Shehab Uddin Sahin, president of Sadar upazila unit of Awami League, said Babul was killed by Jamaat-Shibir men.

None was arrested in connection with the killing as of 5:00pm yesterday.
