Khaleda's office to be dismantled brick by brick

Transport workers will dismantle Khaleda Zia's office brick by brick if she does not withdraw the blockade and hartal immediately, Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan said yesterday.

"Khaleda has confined herself by installing barbwire at her office. We, the workers of Bangladesh, will remove the barbwire and every brick the office has," he said.

"...we will launch such a movement that you will not able to maintain your existence and your politics will meet death."

Law minister's remarks tantamount to contempt of court

SCBA chief tells press STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Supreme Court Bar Association chief yesterday alleged that Law Minister Anisul Huq's comments about a judge who dissented in a war crimes verdict but has not written the full judgment yet were tantamount to "serious contempt of court".

Addressing a press conference at SCBA, Khandker Mahbub Hossain said he could not believe the law minister who was a competent lawyer and had long practiced in the SC would make such comments.

The minister said on Monday, as quoted by the Bangla daily Prothom Alo, "A judge (of the Appellate Division) has dissented in a verdict but has not written the judgment yet. As per law, a verdict cannot be executed until its full text is released. He has been requested to write it. Let's see. 'You dissented. If you are so judicious, what is the problem in writing the

Battered Khilzi Rd constant irritation for residents

Banu, two teachers of Sher-e-Bangla Girls' School who use the road regularly, said during the rainy season, they usually have to wade through rainwater as rickshaw-pullers do not want to ply their vehicles on the small portion of the road.

Moreover, the footpaths on either sides of the road are illegally occupied forcing pedestrians to walk on the road, they added.

Mizanur Rahman, a rickshawpuller, said he avoids the battered part of the road as it takes double the effort to pull rickshaws there.

Nazrul Islam Chowdhury, executive engineer of DNCC, said they have fund for the road and that they hope to start repair works next month.
