"We started three-shift work for optimum rock extraction and processing. But huge quantity of rock remained unsold due to political unrest for over a month and the company is incurring loss of around Tk 1crore daily," said Jabed Siddiqui, general manager

Despite good demand for MGMCL rock, it remained unsold due to the blockade, said Abul Bashar, managing director of the company.
